

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we know from the weather recently, we are well into the season of fall. It always seems to "hit" quite fast. Locally, I have seen an abundance of wildlife on our grounds gathering food for the winter. Could this be a sign of what type of winter we will have? Time will tell.



As we journey through the fall during the pandemic, it is good to remember several things. We must not let our guard down in terms of health protocols both at home and here at Jesus the Good Shepherd. Plans are being finalized for the health protocols we will be using for possible in-door activities. As the colder weather approaches, it must be determined how and when our indoor facilities can be used. Toward that end, I continue to work with the Pandemic Leadership Team which I established soon after the pandemic began as well as with our Safety and Security Committee which is now several years old. Both committees have been great and extremely helpful in keeping us all safe here at JGS.

While I think of it, this is just a pastoral recommendation and reminder about getting your vaccinations. It is anticipated from the medical experts that this winter could be complex in terms of viruses. First, it is recommended to get the flu vaccine in preparation for the winter. For those 55+, it is also recommended to get the shingles vaccine. God willing, we will also have soon a vaccine for COVID-19. I hope and pray that you will seriously consider these vaccines to protect yourself and for those around you as we journey through fall and into winter.

This Sunday's gospel is about a wedding feast. It is always considered an honor to be invited to such! We are being asked to participate in an important event in another person's life, and to share their joy and their blessings.

Presumably, those who invite us have a high regard for our friendship and our presence. To refuse, much less ignore, such an invitation is simply not very good manners. When the friendship that is being celebrated is between us and God, then the obligation to respond is considerably more serious.

The parable invites the question: What is more important than participating in the love and life of Jesus Christ?

Let us pray. Ever-loving God, we turn to you in our need and seek you when we are lost. Let your spirit of friendship open our hearts to receive your love in abundant measure that we might ever rejoice in the presence of your son, Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.



During this election season, our parish will be utilizing materials from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops on Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship and Civilize It. These materials are non-partisan and seek to help Catholics engage in the political process with an informed conscience, as our faith calls us to do. Distribution of other election-related materials on church property will not be permitted. Among other activities, posting flyers or signs, passing out campaign literature, and leaving unauthorized materials anywhere in the building or on car windshields, are prohibited. We appreciate your compliance with this policy.

Voting Guidelines and Dates There has been a lot of confusion as the State adjusts voting guidelines in light of the pandemic. I wanted to make sure you had the following information about the process in Maryland this year. An abbreviated version of this is on our election page (mdcatholic.org/elections).

Oct. 13: Deadline for voter registration

Oct. 20: Requests for mail-in ballot must be received

Oct. 26-Nov. 2: In-person early voting

Nov. 3: Election Day

All registered voters in Maryland may request a mail-in ballot this year to be sent to them by mail, fax, or via a download from the State.

This <u>webpage has very helpful information</u> on mail-in voting. As with any election, it is very important that voters carefully follow all instructions in completing their ballots.

The completed mail-in ballot may be returned by mail or by dropping it off at the local election board office, early voting center or election day voting center.

As of today, early voting sites have been announced, but not Election Day voting sites. Due to the pandemic, the number of voting locations will be lower than in a normal year
