



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we all continue to navigate the pandemic, we also continue to LOVE THY NEIGHBOR! I hope by the time you read this our banner for is hung up in our church for all to see! Thanks to all those who signed the banner and who took the "pledge" to LOVE THY NEIGHBOR. One of the



many ways we carry out this command of Jesus is maintaining health protocols during the pandemic. My deep thanks go to each and every one who is following our procedures here at Jesus the Good Shepherd. You inspire others to do the same.

Once again in the Gospel, we hear about the Pharisees! They were always trying to "needle" and to trap Jesus with their often inane questions on several occasions. And guess what? Each time they lost!

Or, rather, Jesus turned the tables on them and they ended up bringing judgement upon themselves. Paying taxes to Caesar was a sore point for the Jewish people who were under the rule of the Romans. But it was a law of the time and people were subject to the law.

But they were also subjects of God, and Jesus indicates that they could be faithful to God and still be good citizens. Placing God first was just as important for them, as it is for us, in all things – including the upcoming elections on November 3. May I recommend, as you get ready to vote, either by absentee or in person, that you keep the values of God first and foremost in your minds. Also keep in mind the values of our Catholic teaching. This is a wonderful time for you to brush up on our Catholic teachings. Consult both the websites of the Maryland Catholic Conference, the USCCB [Bishops' website] and the *Catholic Catechism*.

#### Social Distancing Space in the Music Ministry!

In 2018, we welcomed the new organ console and pipe chest, after gracious support from a benefactor and several music ministry supporters. During this election season, our parish will be utilizing materials from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops on Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship and Civilize It. These materials are nonpartisan and seek to help Catholics engage in the political process with an informed conscience, as our faith calls us to do. Distribution of other election-related materials on church property will not be permitted. Among other activities, posting flyers or signs, passing out campaign literature, and leaving unauthorized materials anywhere in the building or on car windshields, are prohibited. We appreciate your compliance with this policy.

Voting Guidelines and Dates There has been a lot of confusion as the State adjusts voting guidelines in light of the pandemic. I wanted to make sure you had the following information about the process in Maryland this year. An abbreviated version of this is on our election page (mdcatholic.org/elections).

> Oct. 20: Requests for mail-in ballot must be received Oct. 26-Nov. 2: In-person early voting

Nov. 3: Election Day

All registered voters in Maryland may request a mail-in ballot this year to be sent to them by mail, fax, or via a download from the State. This webpage has very helpful information on mail-in voting. As with any election, it is very important that voters carefully follow all instructions in completing their ballots.

The completed mail-in ballot may be returned by mail or by dropping it off at the local election board office, early voting center or election day voting center.

As of today, early voting sites have been announced, but not Election Day voting sites. Due to the pandemic, the number of voting locations will be lower than in a normal year
