Some Reasons to Attend Daily Mass and Ways It Will Change You Part 1 of a 2 part series.

For many, the idea of getting to daily Mass is a dream. We may easily dismiss the notion without really giving it much thought. But ask some daily Mass attendees why they come to daily Mass and you hear one of the following reasons:

- **Half-hour of Peace.** No matter your stage in life or your daily schedule, chances are you could use an extra half-hour to recharge. Our lives are noisy and they don't have to be. Our smartphones, other electronic devices and the television usually win the battle for our attention. But is that all that life is? No. Go to daily Mass. Unplug. Even leave your smartphone in your car. You won't regret it.
- **Moves the focus AWAY from ourselves.** Our lives are always busy. We need to see how little we actually consider something

or someone beyond/outside ourselves. Going to Mass, making it a daily habit, causes us to focus on something else for a half hour and it is not something that we necessarily have to "do": the Mass is our highest act of worship. Every time Mass is offered, whether you are there or not, it is a sacrifice offered on YOUR BEHALF. At Mass, Christ invites us to receive Him in this sacrifice as often as we are able. The Mass is for you. Give part of each day for Him."

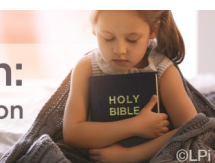

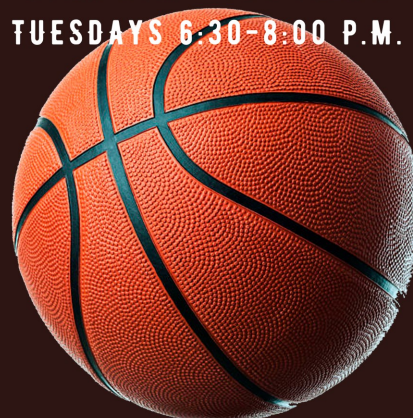
