

"From the Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

October is often referred to as the Month of the Holy Rosary. For many of us when we were young, the recitation of the Rosary was a part of our family and parish life, especially during October. Sadly, the number of families that have prayed the Rosary together has dwindled. However, I am seeing more and more signs of a rebirth of the prayer devotion of the Rosary.

I have found the Rosary so helpful in my own prayer life. Perhaps the best way I can explain it is I have always found praying the rosary soothing. Whenever I am uneasy, faced with a major decision or confronted by something that came to me quite unexpectedly, the Rosary provides solace. In addition, I am always moved that so many people ask me to pray for them and for their needs. So, the Rosary has been the perfect remedy for praying not only for my needs but for others. This might sound a bit weird, but I have always had a sense of new confidence that all will work out for the best when I recite a Rosary.

The beauty of the Rosary is that it offers us contemplation. This contemplation is twofold. First, we reflect upon the mysteries of our Faith, e.g., Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, Glorious. We focus upon those events within the Gospels, from the Annunciation to the coronation of our Blessed Mother in heaven. When we pray the mysteries, we place ourselves within a particular moment of salvation history that is highlighted in the mysteries and we allow ourselves to be moved by that experience.

Second, when we pray the Rosary, the steady rhythm invites us to intentionally visualize and pray for a particular person or matter of concern to us. This can occur when the Rosary is prayed privately, but also during its recitation as a community when it is powerful public witness of our faith.

Pope Francis has referred to the Rosary as "spiritual medicine" – a prayer that is "good for the heart" [Nov. 17, 2013]. During this month dedicated to the Rosary, take time to discover or rediscover this prayer – either as individuals or as a family. I especially invite all Moms and Dads to take the lead! It will bring many blessings to your family. If you regularly pray the Rosary, consider introducing someone to its beauty and its power.

The Mysteries of the Rosary Have you ever wanted to explore the life of Jesus and Mary in a deeper way? Each decade highlights a sacred episode:

Joyful Mysteries: Through the Annunciation (1)

and Visitation (2), we get a glimpse at Mary's joyful yes to God. She gives birth to Jesus in the Nativity (3). Mary and Joseph present their son at the temple (4) and bring him there again when he is a teenager (5).

Luminous Mysteries: Jesus is baptized in the Jordan River (1) before Mary gives him a nudge to his first miracle at Cana (2). Jesus proclaims the Gospel (3), is transfigured on Mount Tabor (4), and institutes the Eucharist (5). The light is shining!

Sorrowful Mysteries: Jesus prays in agony in Gethsemane (1), knowing his hour of suffering has come. After his betrayal and arrest, Jesus is scourged (2) and crowned with thorns (3). He carries his cross (4), and Mary stands at the foot of the cross as he is crucified (5).

Glorious Mysteries: Christ is risen in glory (1)! After appearing to those he loves, he ascends into heaven (2). Jesus' followers receive the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (3). Mary, unaffected by original sin, is assumed body and soul into heaven (4), where she is crowned queen, humble mother of Christ the King (5). ©LPi




