



Social Distancing Space in the Music Ministry!

The music ministry has had many additions over the past decade to Jesus the Good Shepherd Church. In 2013, we welcomed our new Music Director, Katie Evans. In 2018, we welcomed the new organ console and pipe chest, after gracious support from a benefactor and several music ministry supporters. Now, in 2020 and the COVID -19 Pandemic, the liturgy misses its different choirs and guest musi-

cians we have had in the past!

As a result of the pandemic, the music ministry has had to reevaluate the music ministry space for the future. It is our plan to remove the current pews that dwell behind the organ and piano, to provide unique configurations for music members and their instruments. The shape of a chamber group or choir is optimally a semicircle, where the end participants can turn their bodies towards the conductor. With the removal of the pews, we can more physically distance from music participants or musicians, as well as have a

liturgical divide between the participants and the assembly. What will we do with the old pews? The Music Ministry would like to explore any interests in purchasing of the pews, and the proceeds would go towards the repairs of the floor and fixtures or seating
