

**PRAYER FOR THE CANONIZATION OF THE FOUNDER OF THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS:** The Knights of Columbus ["K of C"] is the largest, Catholic fraternal organization in the world. It was established in 1881 in Connecticut by a priest. Father Michael J. McGivney wanted to provide a Catholic alternative to secret societies [such as *Freemasonry*] and to support the families of men who died while working in factories. The organization grew quickly as men were drawn to the ideals of serving the Church and living with loyalty, charity and respect for others. We are so blessed with our own K of C Council here at JGS.

Father McGivney is on the road to sainthood. He is now called "Venerable." The next step in the canonization process is to be declared "Blessed." This requires a miracle. There is an official prayer for this purpose. If you know of someone who is very ill and in need of a miracle, this prayer to God through the intercession of Father McGivney just might be the miracle that he needs to be declared a Saint of the Catholic Church:

"God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor. Through the example of his life and virtue may we follow your Son, Jesus Christ, more closely, fulfilling his commandment of charity and building up his Body which is the Church.

Let the inspiration of your servant prompt us to greater confidence in your love so that we may continue his work of caring for the needy and the outcast. We humbly ask that you glorify your venerable servant Father Michael J. McGivney on earth according to the desire of your holy will. Through his intercession, grant the favor I now present [here make your request]. Through Christ our Lord. Amen."
