„From the Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we soon approach the beginning of November, we come upon several special liturgical celebrations. Tuesday, November 1, is the Solemnity of All Saints. It is a holyday of obligation on which the Church honors countless men and women saints who have gone before us. Masses will be celebrated at 8:15 a.m. and 7 p.m. The next day is All Souls' Day. Although not formally a holyday, it still remains a day of prayer as we remember all who have died in the Lord. Our one Mass will be celebrated at the usual time, 8:15 a.m. It is also a beautiful tradition to pray throughout the month of November for our beloved deceased. If you would like to remember your loved one during the Mass of Remembrance, you may do so by using the All Souls envelopes found in the envelope racks in the vestibule. Envelopes may be returned via the mail slot or the offertory.

Most of all, our annual MASS OF REMEMBRANCE will be celebrated Saturday, November 5 at 4:30 p.m. At that Mass, all those who have died in the Lord from our community since All Souls Day of last year will be publicly recognized. Our choir will be present to add solemnity to this special celebration. I hope you will make every effort to come, supporting the loved ones of the deceased and praying in a particular fashion for the happy repose of the souls of those we will especially recognize.

Last but not least, the annual celebration of Thanksgiving is Thursday, November 24. In an effort to increase our attendance, our "big" Mass for Thanksgiving will take place the Vigil of Thanksgiving on Wednesday, November 23 at 7 p.m. At this Mass, we invite you to bring any "breads" which you plan to bring to your Thanksgiving Day table for a special blessing at the end of Mass. We hope that in offering this new Thanksgiving Vigil Mass, this will better accommodate Thanksgiving Day schedules when people want to rest, travel and/or get ready for their Thanksgiving Day meal on Thanksgiving Day itself. We will still have a simple Mass at the usual time on Thanksgiving morning at 8:15 a.m.

November is such an awesome month! Make it special for yourself by giving some extra time to God and by joining us for these special celebrations. God bless you! Father Mike

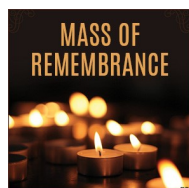


We are all called to be saints!

What is it?

Children's Liturgy of the Word is a time during the 10:45 a.m. Mass where younger children can experience the Word of God from a child's perspective. The children process to the chapel where they read, lead, sing, and give intercessory prayer. They light candles, participate in the pews, break open the gospel, pray together, and have a complete Liturgy of the Word that is more geared towards them! It is a complete and legitimate liturgy that draws them into a deeper relationship with Christ. OOPS! LEAVING LIGHTS ON?

With the increase in use and a gradual return to things normal following the pandemic, our facility over the last few weeks has also seen an increase in the number of lights left on all night by groups who use our facilities.

To all groups who use our facility, especially the coordinators, kindly remember to turn off all lights when you leave. Please keep in mind also that there is not a designated person who walks through the building each night to turn off lights. Every group/every individual is responsible. As a rule of thumb, "the last one out, turns off lights." This appeal is being made as our electric bill is 50% higher than it was for this same period last year. If you/your group uses our facility, thank you for keeping this in mind.



THANK YOU SO MUCH FOR YOUR ONGOING SUPPORT OF THE LADIES OF CHARITY FOOD PANTRY!

We collected 681.15 lbs at the pick-up on October 21st. For the month of September your donations helped us serve over 250 families representing nearly 650 people. We gave out over 15,800 lbs of food. Prior to the

start of this school year, the Ladies of Charity also gave out 177 backpacks filled with various school supply items. **Holidays are fast approaching – we are most in need of items we will distribute with our Thanksgiving and Christmas groceries including brownie mix, corn muffin mix, gravy, stuffing, sweet potatoes, cranberries and canned pineapple. Thanks again!**

UPDATE, CENTRE RESTROOMS RENOVATION: We are happy to report that all the required permits have been received for the renovation of our Centre Restrooms. We expect the contractor to contact us very soon to schedule the beginning of the renovation. The work is expected to take 6-8 weeks. During this time, there are no restrooms available in the Centre, but we have plenty of options in the meantime. Clear signage for alternative restrooms will be posted during this brief period of inconvenience.

If your ministry uses the Centre to meet, your meeting may have to be moved to another room or postponed until the renovations are complete. As soon as we know more, we will let you know.

UPDATE ON HAITI: Our sister parish, Our Lady of Mount Carmel, continues to make progress despite the terrible situation in which it finds itself. Aside from devastation due to hurricanes, the pandemic, the unstable government situation and the general loss of law and order throughout the republic, the faith of the Catholic Church remains very strong. Our sister parish is truly blessed with great local leadership, especially that of its pastor, Father Marc Donald and the bishop of the Diocese of Jeremie, Bishop Joseph DeCoste, S.J.

Jesus the Good Shepherd maintains regular communication with Father Marc. He recently requested more funds for his church and Catholic elementary school. Upon the recommendation of our Haiti Twinning Committee, a donation of \$8,000.00 was recently sent. A portion of this will go toward solar panels to enable them to have interior lighting.

Please, please continue your financial support of our sister parish in Haiti. JGS is truly making a difference there! Most of all, please continue to keep the good people of our sister parish in your thoughts and prayers. We are always inspired by the faith of the Haitian people despite great odds. The local leaders are to be commended for their perseverance and courage amidst significant personal sacrifice as they minister to God's people in that most impoverished area of the western hemisphere.

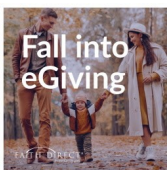
