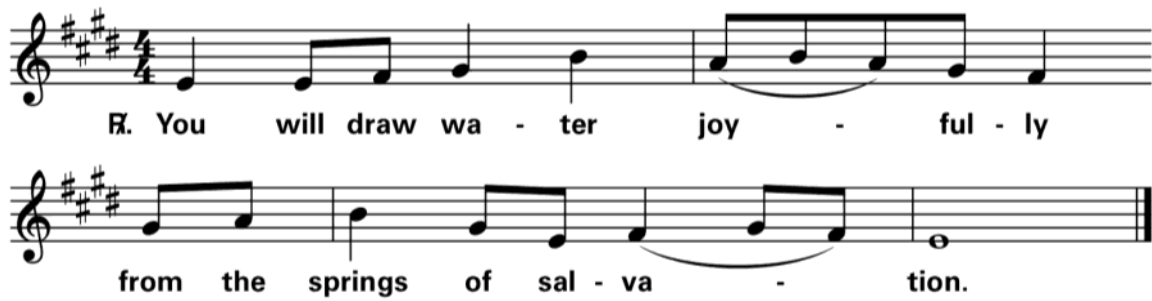

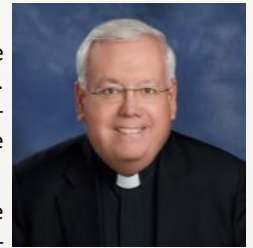

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

With today's Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord, we end officially the Christmas Season. And what a beautiful Christmas Season we celebrated here at Jesus the Good Shepherd despite restrictions due to the pandemic.



I am deeply appreciative and grateful to the *Pandemic Leadership Team [PLT]*. I have previously shared with you the news of this wonderful group of parishioners who rallied to my plea shortly after the pandemic started last March to assist me in leading our community through the pandemic. Planning for Christmas in particular was one of their most recent tasks.

I am so grateful for the gifts of their wisdom and dedication to our community. Without their selfless dedication [many spent an *extraordinary* amount of personal and family time before, during and after Christmas on our campus], our Christmas celebrations would not have celebrated the beautiful way in which they were. In particular, the first ever OUTDOOR 3 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass with at least 350 in attendance. It was a *huge triumph* – despite the weather! Our entire community owes a *huge debt of prayerful gratitude* to the PLT for all the time and effort they spent on our behalf.

The PLT is already at work thinking about plans for Lent which begins in mid-February. Ash Wednesday in mid-February will be another “first” for us during the pandemic. We remain very positive to have something offered that is both uplifting and safe to “launch” our upcoming celebration of Lent.

Speaking of a “launch!” You might say that the Baptism of Jesus was his official “launch” into His earthly ministry. In today's Gospel, John the Baptist called people to prepare themselves for God's coming. By choosing to be baptized, Jesus expressed his agreement with John, stood in solidarity with his people, and modeled openness to God's plan.

In doing so, Jesus hears words of affirmation and empowerment. When we renew our own baptismal promises, we proclaim and celebrate how God has affirmed and empowered us in Christ.

Let us pray. All powerful Father, we have been reborn by water and the Holy Spirit. Forgive our sins. Keep us steadfast in our commitment to grow in holiness in 2021. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

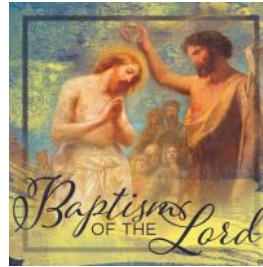

MARCH FOR LIFE MORE IMPORTANT THAN EVER! Following a 9:30 a.m. Pro-Life prayer service on Fri. Jan. 29 a bus will depart JGS at 10:30 for the March for Life Rally and March in Washington DC. Given the 2020 election results it is vital for all conscientious Christians to continue to stand up for the sanctity of life! Due to Covid restrictions seating on the bus will be socially distance and therefore limited so sign

THE CATHOLIC CHURCH SUPPORTS COVID-19 VACCINES: Both COVID vaccines of *Moderna* and *Pfizer* are in line with previous moral statements by Pope Benedict XVI and the Pontifical Council for Life. Receiving either vaccine is morally permissible and is certainly an important pro-life decision that would help to defend the most vulnerable members who are at the most risk of developing severe coronavirus cases. Because there is usually not a choice in the vaccine one receives when it becomes available, it is morally permissible to take the vaccine in order to protect the lives of those who are most at risk of serious coronavirus.

For those interested in more information, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith [CDF] published a statement on December 17, 2020 at the request of Pope Francis and he ordered its publication on the morality of using some anti-COVID 19 vaccines. It is available on the Vatican website. The statement reinforces material previously published by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops [USCCB] and the Catholic Health Association [CHA].

In addition, the Catholic bishops of Maryland, in a December 12, 2020 letter, strongly recommends all Catholics to receive the COVID-19 vaccines. The administration of the vaccines began December 14 to front-line health care workers across the nation and is also being administered to residents of long-term care facilities.

At this point in time, there is a significant amount of misinformation about the COVID-19 vaccines. In light of the teaching of the Catholic Church, all parishioners are strongly encouraged to consider the life-saving impact of the vaccine, and to receive the vaccine if and when they are able and when the vaccine becomes locally available.

The health protocol measures taken by Jesus the Good Shepherd [e.g., social-distancing, mask wearing, sign-ups at Masses for contact tracing, disinfecting after each Mass, etc.] as well as the new vaccines, will even more assist to protect the lives of all in our community, surrounding community and beyond.

COVID-19 UPDATE

Because we love our neighbor, JGS has been operating at a capacity of 25% in the church.



Even though our max capacity is 500, given the shape of the venue, and the pews, we could not safely increase our capacity beyond 125 while keeping 6-ft distances.

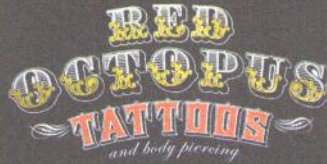
