

Jesus the Good Shepherd Catholic Community Covenant Prayer



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today we are especially blessed as we also celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints! We are invited to think of all those holy men and women who have gone before us, especially those designated as such by the



Church, to be inspired by them and to pray to them to intercede for us from their special place in heaven. To complement today's feast, we are given in today's Gospel the Beatitudes. They comprise one of the most familiar and beloved texts of the Gospel. For Matthew, they act as the foundation of Jesus' mission.

For Jesus, the Beatitudes offer a twofold message. First, they announce a present blessing. The poor in spirit – those who mourn, those who are merciful, etc. – are already blessed. God has indeed favored them. Second, the Beatitudes place a future challenge before the followers of Jesus: they are called on to recognize the blessings of God and to strive to live in such a way as to receive the same blessings.

Let us pray. In your abundant providence, O God, you have chosen holy men and women to be examples of the mercy and the sacrificial love of your Son, Jesus Christ. May we strive to imitate their holiness and follow the same Lord, who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.
