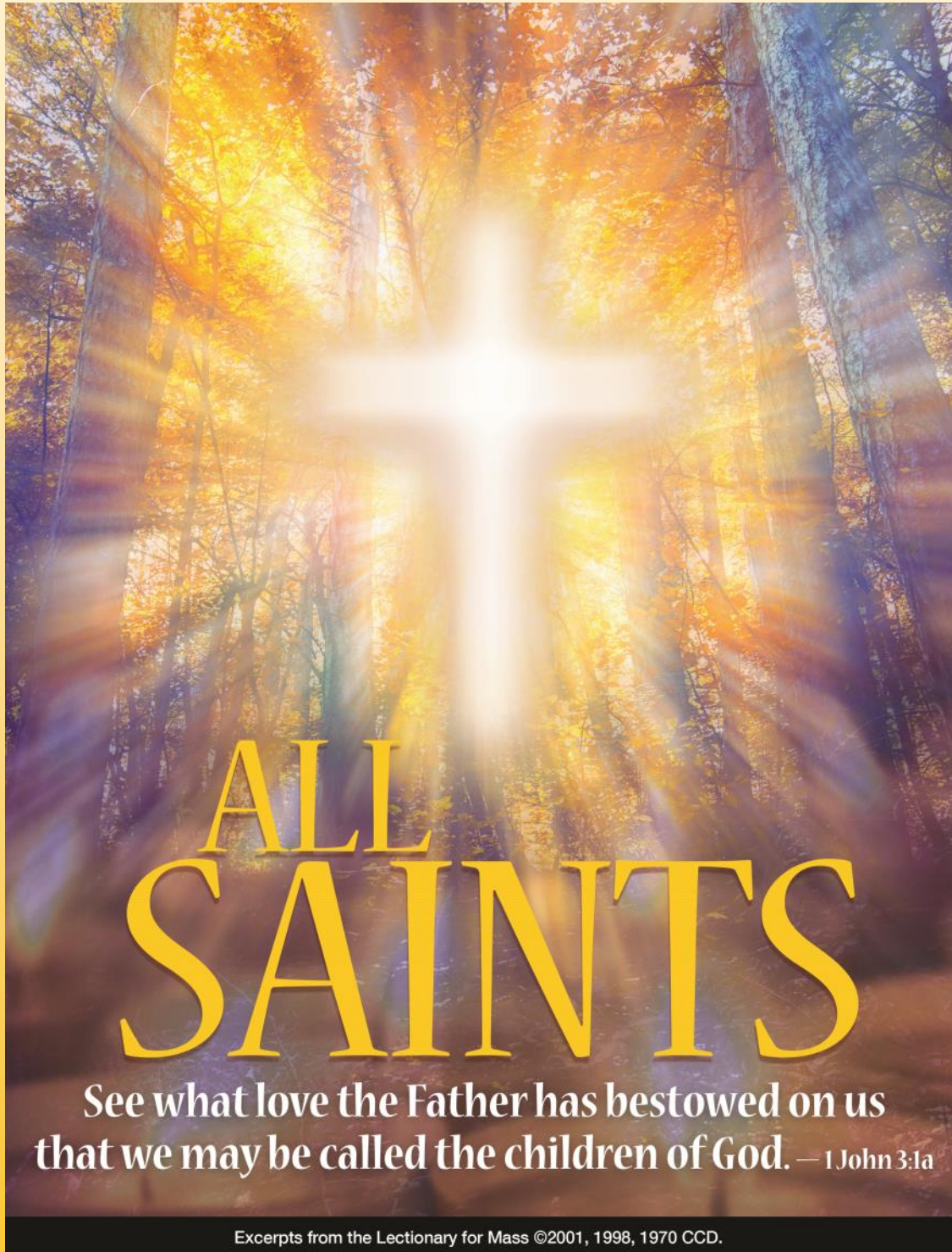

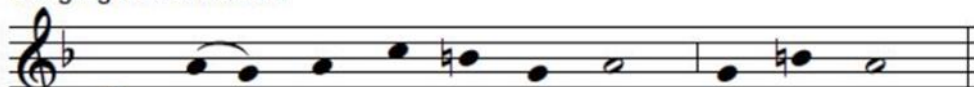
We pray that we might be a source of compassion toward the poor, justice for the oppressed, peace for the troubled, healing for the wounded, and wisdom for the searching.

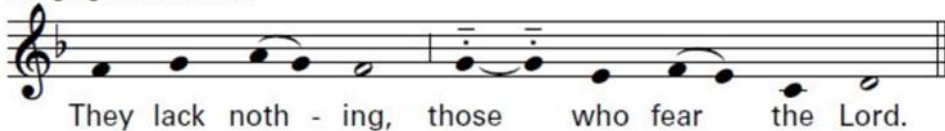

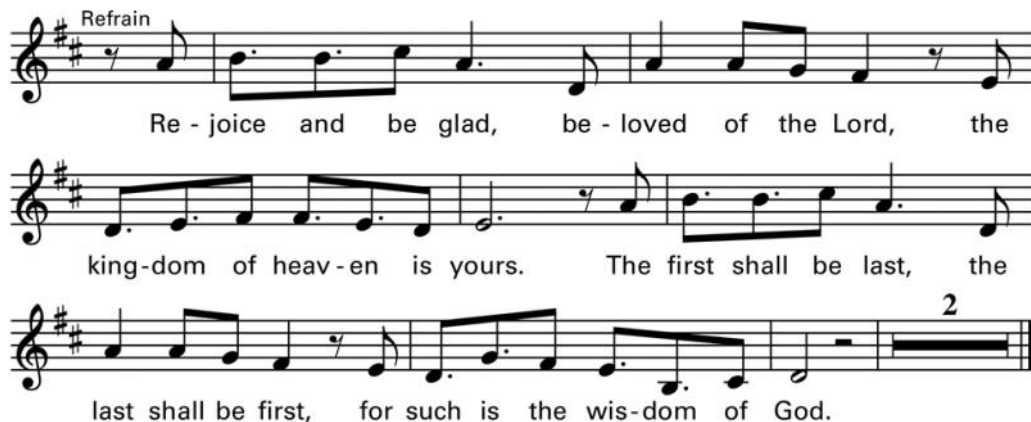

Today we are especially blessed as we also celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints! 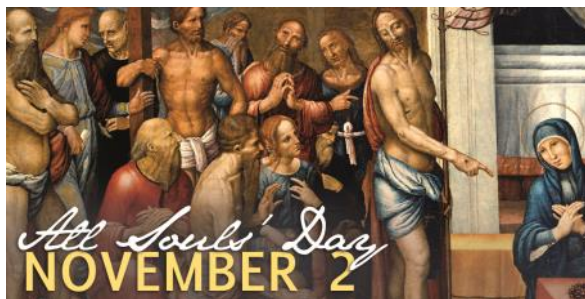

Let us pray. In your abundant providence, O God, you have chosen holy men and women to be examples of the mercy and the sacrificial love of your Son, Jesus Christ. May we strive to imitate their holiness and follow the same Lord, who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

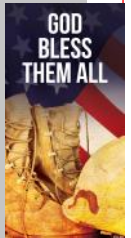


