





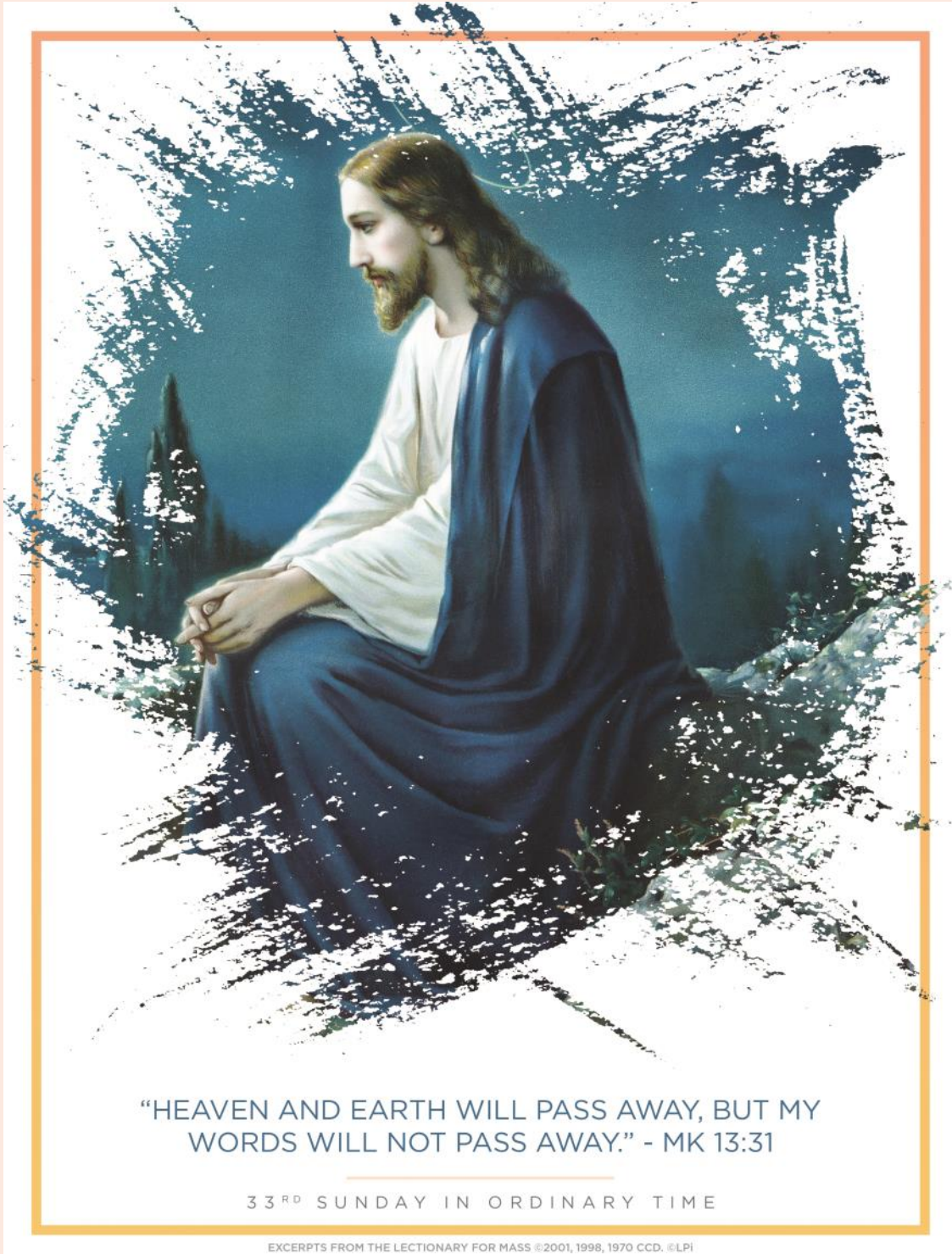

At this time of year, it is normal to hear in the weekend Gospels about the “end-times.” Can we read the signs of the times?

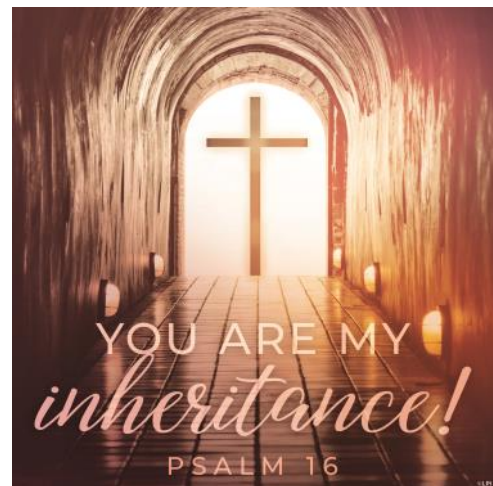


Most of us are not meteorologists, but if we are attentive to the world around us, we may be able to predict what weather will affect us.

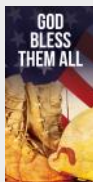

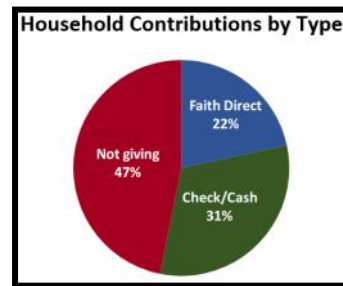
