

Dear Community Members,

As I write this, cold temperatures have descended upon us and fall is certainly here! The daylight becomes shorter as we transition to winter. In terms of the church year, November is traditionally the month that we as a Church recall all our deceased ones and pray for them during this month.



Remembering our deceased ones at this time of year gives the perfect opportunity to update ourselves on the Church's teaching on the afterlife and the proper way to bury our deceased loved ones.

Almost three years ago, the Holy See issued an instruction called, To Rise with Christ. It re-affirms our Catholic belief in the resurrection of the dead. Through His death and resurrection, Christ has freed us from sin and gave us access to a new life "so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life" [Rom. 6:4].

The document also insists that the bodies and remains of the deceased be treated with respect and be laid to rest in a consecrated place.

- The Church accepts cremation as a viable option, but forbids the scattering of ashes and of keeping cremated remains at home. Cremation, in fact, has been officially permitted by the Church since 1963. As is evidenced by our own Columbarium in our cemetery here at Jesus the Good Shepherd, cremation has become a quite popular option for burial.
- The practice of burying the dead is considered one of the corporal works of mercy, reflecting the burial of Christ and expresses hope in the resurrection when the person's body and soul will be reunited.
- Placing the ashes of cremated persons in a sacred place "prevents the faithful departed from being forgotten or their remains from being shown a lack of respect" which is more likely to occur as time goes on and the people closest to the deceased also pass away.
- · Lastly, the Church also reminds us that the ashes of the faithful may not be preserved in mementos, pieces of jewelry or other objects. In cases when the deceased has previously requested or the next of kin has requested the scattering of ashes, a Christian funeral "must be denied." As Catholic Christians, we believe in the resurrection of the body and this must be the principle of our understanding and practice.

The Cemetery here at Jesus the Good Shepherd is open to all people of all faiths. If you are interested in information about our cemetery, you are most welcome to visit our parish website. You may also call and speak directly with a representative of Catholic Cemeteries of the Archdiocese of Washington, 301-475-5005.

During November, let us keep in mind the beautiful words of the Preface for the Mass for the Dead:

> "In Him, the hope of blessed resurrection has dawned, That those saddened by the certainty of dying Might be consoled by the promise of immortality to come. Indeed for your faithful, Lord, life is changed not ended, And, when this earthly dwelling turns to dust, An eternal dwelling is made ready for them in heaven."
