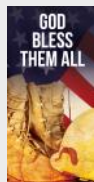

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The weekend of November 27/28, the Church welcomes the Season of Advent. A Blessed and Joyful Advent to you!

Advent is a season of REBIRTH, RENEWAL, ARRIVAL. With Christmas items already on sale on-line, in stores and in markets around us, this “pushing forward” of Christmas prevents us from experiencing the mys-tery of Advent as it should be celebrated. Individually and collectively as Catholic Christians, we are called to recover the original meaning of this season of Advent as a time of stillness, waiting and watching in or-der to experience more intentionally its saving power in our lives.

During Advent, we hear marvelous texts that come to us from the prophet Isaiah. For example,

“The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light; and they that dwell in the land of the shadow of death, upon them hath the light shined” [Is. 9:2]

● Practice ●

Light a candle in a dark room in your house and sit comfortably and qui-etly in front of it. Watch to see how the flickering light brightens every-thing in the room, casting a soft light upon it all . . . this is the light that wants to shine in your home, in the places where you work and sleep. But also in those places where you are worried and troubled. In the times when you gather with your family and friends. And in all the con-flicts and tensions you face with others.

Trust this light, which sometimes seems dim to you, to shine brightly upon every aspect of your life, bringing the mystery of God’s love into your heart and home. In this way, you will begin to discover that you can truly be at home wherever you are. For we can only dwell in the “house of our heart” where this mystery dwells. Here we find our true home, and here we learn to welcome God who seeks to come to us as light and love. Only then do we find ourselves truly at home, even in the midst of what is restless within in.

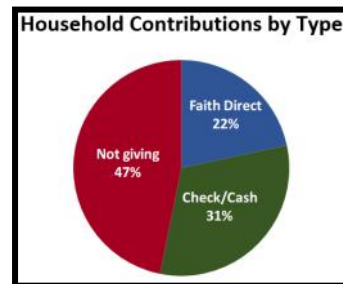
