



From Christmas Season to Ground Hog Day

As we end the Christmas season with the Baptism of the Lord, we will continue the Gospel of Mark with Year A in Ordinary Time. This year, we get an extra bonus Feast that extends a little Christmas cheer! This year February 2, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, falls on a Sunday, which has not happened in 6 years since 2014. This marks 40 days after Christmas, with the Purification of Mary and the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, dating back to Jewish custom. Traditionally, this feast was also known as Candelmas, Candle Mass, celebrated with many candles to signify the Canticle of Simeon when he proclaims that Jesus is "A light to the revelation of the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel."

Candlemas was the day when some cultures predicted weather patterns. An old English song goes: If Candlemas be fair and bright, come winter, have another flight; If Candlemas bring clouds and rain, go winter, and come not again. Thus, if the sun cast a shadow on Candlemas day, more winter was on the way; if there was no shadow, winter was thought to be ending soon. Of course, this practice led to the folklore behind "Groundhog Day," which falls on February 2.

How are we called as servants to the liturgy?

As we begin a new liturgical schedule, we are all called to be the Lord's Hands and Feet during Mass. Having newly trained liturgical ministers means sometimes helping those who are unsure or are still understanding the schedule tools we have in place. Thank you in advance for helping out any fellow parishioners, young or old, who are new to the work of the people, the "liturgy." If someone is having trouble walking, JGS has two wheelchairs. One is in the Coat room in the Centre and the second wheelchair is in the Shepherd's Cove.


HELP CHA WIN THE RECYCLING COMPETITION: CHA will join the
