

All: Grant unshakable confidence in your sovereign provision.


For those waiting for justice and mercy to reign:



HAPPY ADVENT! As we enter this period of twenty-eight days to prepare our hearts and minds once again for the coming of Christ at Christmas, and his arrival in glory at the end of time, we become more eager, excited and more ready to meet our Lord!


LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK






