For all of us waiting for God's kingdom to come:


All: Grant that we might have the peace of Christ as we wait, the love of Christ as we act, and the grace of Christ as we speak.

A Joyful Advent!



Waiting is a fundamental part of our lives. We often find ourselves waiting. Advent is a time of waiting, a season of expectation when we learn how to wait for God's coming into our hearts – again and again. In these weeks, we know in our hearts that when God does come all will be well and we will experience what it means to come home to ourselves.

#### • Practice •

Pay particular attention, throughout the day, to times when you find yourself waiting – for an elevator, a ride, in a line at the store, in traffic, for a quest to arrive.

In such moments, pay attention to what it means to wait – with expectation. Attend to your impatience, saying quietly to yourself: It really is not that important that I arrive. Give yourself fully to this moment, and seek to rest within yourself. Say to yourself: "I'm not just waiting in traffic; I'm waiting for God, who is already present in my life. I'm waiting for the Lord who wants me to welcome him, and who will come when I am truly present."

If you sense your own impatience, give it to God. When you do this, you'll find yourself becoming quiet in your heart and begin to sense God protecting you. You'll start to feel yourself becoming free of the pressure of fulfilling others' expectations. In this moment, give your waiting and even your impatience to God. In doing so, you'll begin to find your discomfort fade away. A newfound patience will bring new energy and aliveness to you.

Unfortunately, the tables are showing more "wear and tear." In addition, with today's technology, new tables are more durable but more lightweight. We are currently inviting members if they would like to make a donation specifically toward a new table. The new tables will be so much easier for people to set up/breakdown for our many social needs at JGS.

Our current tables which are still useable will be kept and placed in storage for when we need tables for outside events [e.g., Covenant Sunday]. This will help us to rent fewer tables in the future and reduce annual expenses. The cost of a new table is \$438.57. 
