





Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the midst of the pandemic, the Season of Advent brings us all hope and joy – IF we allow it to!

The servants in the Gospel for this FIRST SUN-DAY OF ADVENT were *physically* watching for the return of their master; our watching is of a *spiritual* nature.



Our readiness to welcome the Lord rests in our heart. There, we sort through the obstacles that prevent us from recognizing the Lord in the midst of our lives; that is, things like busy schedules that interfere with a time for prayer; like the fear and uncertainty of the pandemic; like a singular focus on our own interests at the expense of the needs of others; like too-filled personal schedules that keep us from the liturgical celebrations of the Church. ** 4 priests will be present.

For your convenience, this time slot is daylight, in late afternoon, but before dinnertime and not in the evening darkness.

Let us pray.

Ever-loving God, your chosen people were a people of great hope and you did not disappoint them as they waited for your salvation. Grant to us, who await the glorious return of your Son and the celebration of His birth at Christmas, Hopeful, peaceful and joyful hearts. Amen.

Advent Wreath Prayer for Home

Saturday evening before the First Sunday of Advent, gather the household around the wreath. Point out that the wreath is circular, with no beginning or end, like God's love. Explain there are four candles, one for each Sunday of Advent. The third candle is rose because on their third Sunday we celebrate the joy of waiting for Christmas. Before you begin, find the reading John 1:1-5 in your bible, and choose a reader. You can begin with a simple advent song "O Come O Come Emmanuel" or "Soon and Very Soon." Have an older child or adult read the leader parts. You can continue this prayer service each Sunday.

Leader: Since ancient times, people have marked the passage of time with the light of the sun. in this holy season of Advent, we observe the passage of time through the light of this wreath, for each candle represents another week closer to the radiance of the newborn Son Jesus. Our anticipation for his glorious arrival can teach us much about patience as well as sharing the flame of our faith. So let us begin our time of prayer with the sign of the cross.

All: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy-Spirit. Amen.

(Light the candle(s). Then stand and sing an Alleluia.)

Reader: A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. John 1:1-5. (read Gospel passage.) The Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you Lord, Jesus Christ. (All sit and observe silence.)

Leader: God Our Creator, Bless us as we gather around this Advent wreath, Ever anxious for the arrival of your Son, Jesus. Renew us with your patience and The light of your promise. Help us to prepare our hearts so that we are open to your coming into our lives. We ask this through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen. (All make the sign of the cross).

Because we love our neighbor, JGS has been operating at a capacity of 25% in the church.
