Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Here it is November! Probably like most of you, I ask myself, "Where did October go?!?!"

We hear in this weekend's Gospel the story of the widow's "mite" or her offering in the temple. This story invites us once again to reflect on what we ourselves



offer to God/what we give to God. As Catholics, we are called to offer to God through our parish the "three 'T's": our Time, our Talent and our Treasure [if you are interested in an overview of how our parish in general is doing in terms of treasure, kindly look at the financial report elsewhere in today's bulletin].

Jesus has high praise for the widow. She gives from her poverty while the wealthy of her time give from their surplus. Jesus tells the disciples that the widow's gift is the greatest or the "mightiest" of everyone's gifts offered. Why? Its greatness comes from her own sacrifice: the gift cost her everything.

The sacrifice then leads her to a total dependence upon God to satisfy all her needs. Both the sacrifice and the dependence show a relationship with God that God desires and considers mighty indeed! In our own time, we can ask ourselves if our personal abundance has made our dependence on God more, less or even nonexistent.

Sadly, the latter is dominant in our society today. I recently came across an Amish saying that goes along this line of thinking: "Grasp eternal values firmly and you will hold loosely this world's treasures."

Let us pray. God of all creation, you want for nothing. Please accept the humble gifts we offer your Church and our church family at Jesus the Good Shepherd. Help us to give of ourselves; bless us, grace us, and allow our gifts to bear great fruit. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.



LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

It all really boils down to a matter of the heart, and actions do speak louder than words. We cannot hide from the truth. A problem with religion is that it is possible for someone to

make everything appear to be right when actually it is not. We can say all of the right prayers, perform all of the proscribed rituals, claim that we adhere to orthodox doctrines and still lead a distorted, empty and sometimes pitiful life. Only actions springing from true and deep sacrifice demonstrate true integrity. Without sacrifice, even the noblest looking actions can amount to nothing. It is no wonder, then, that the widow who contributed from her poverty received great admiration from Jesus. While it may not always appear to be the case, God has a special care and regard for those who depend upon him in times of trouble and want. Only the person who is truly poor is the only one who can see this. Because of a lack of trust, the one who has much is afraid to take a risk and sees only what they possess as their only security. ©LPi






