


Hope for Those Who Are Watching





Did you know?

Monday, Dec. 12 we celebrate Our Lady of Guadalupe

The Blessed Mother

appeared Dec. 9-12, 1531 to St. Juan Diego and asked him to be her messenger.

- Our Lady requested a chapel be built in the Tepeyac Valley (now Mexico City) in her honor.
- St. Juan Diego told the bishop about our Lady's request, but the bishop asked St. Juan Diego for a sign. Our Lady tells St. Juan Diego to pick up flowers from the valley and bring them to the bishop.
- St. Juan Diego brought the flowers to the bishop and when he opened his tilma (outer garment/cloak), our Lady's image appeared.
- The flowers were red roses that do not survive in the middle of winter.
- The image of the bishop and others around him during the presentation of the flowers can be seen in our Lady's eyes with modern technology.
- She is the Patroness of the Americas, Patroness of the Unborn. Pray to her for the protection of unborn babies!
- The tilma is made of cactus fiber, known to be of very poor quality. However, the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe is not just a painting, and it has survived a bomb explosion and an acid spill. Replicas have deteriorated over a short period of time
- The ribbon above her waist shows she is pregnant and she appeared just two weeks before Dec. 24, Christmas day!
- Our Lady of Guadalupe's image in the tilma is full of symbolism. Watch Guadalupe Video on FORMED for more information and details about Our Lady of Guadalupe.

LIVING THE REVIVAL

Is the Mass a sacrifice? The Protestant reformers rejected the understanding of the Mass as a sacrifice. Dr. Brant Pitre walks us through the debate and how the Church clarified


Lenten Mission to TN

ANNUAL CHRISTMAS GIFT TO OUR COMMUNITY: We depend very heavily on our annual Christmas collection. Our Christmas Collection helps us get off to a positive start for the new year. Because Christmas falls on a Sunday this year, all offertory donations above our usual Sunday collection are considered our Christmas collection.

For example, if our usual Sunday collection is \$7,000, but the entire Christmas collection is \$50,000, this means that \$7,000 is taxable to the Archdiocese of Washington; \$43,000 is considered "exempt" from the usual diocesan tax and is retained for our own use at Jesus the Good Shepherd. It is only when Christmas falls on a day other than a Sunday that the entire Christmas collection is tax-exempt by the Archdiocese of Washington.

Because Christmas falls on a Sunday this year, some members of our community may be able to increase their Sunday offertory donation 15%. Whatever all households of our community can do to help make up this difference this year is greatly appreciated. Thank you for your prayerful consideration of this extraordinary request - due again to the fact that Christmas falls on a Sunday this year. God bless you!
