PLEASE SLOW DOWN: Over the years, we have seen more traffic on our grounds due to the use of the pavilion, an increase in truck deliveries due to more "on-line" shopping, visits to our cemetery, a gradual return to more social activities at JGS and the regular, daily traffic patterns for Cardinal Hickey Academy. Unfortunately, there has

also been a simultaneous increase in speeding. This past summer saw some minor car accidents resulting in car damage, "rattled nerves," and the involvement of personal insurance companies of drivers.

To help remedy this situation, a few years ago more safety/caution signs were installed. Despite these words of caution and increase in number, there continues to be excessive speeding on parish grounds warranting further action. This action is being pro-active to address the future safety of all parishioners and visitors, especially the most vulnerable among us – our children, the disabled and the elderly.


As a result, speed bumps at four critical areas in our large parking lot are about to be installed. This action is being taken after consultation with and recommendation by Cardinal Hickey Academy, the Safety and Security Committee and the Stewardship Committee of JGS. There will be an evaluation to see if these few speedbumps will work in slowing down vehicles. Hopefully, this will sufficiently address the problem. Thank you for your cooperation in slowing down in general as you enter, park and leave our parking lot for the overall safety of all drivers and pedestrians.

This Third Sunday of Advent is shaped by the call to joy. The vestments are rose, a foreshadowing of the Christian joy that will be proclaimed for all people. Today's Mass recalls Paul's words to the Philippians, where the apostle writes from prison to admonish his brothers: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, 'Rejoice!.' Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near [Phil. 4:4-5].

Of course, we know that many today – and often enough we ourselves – find the call to rejoice a difficult one to hear. After all, one cannot be commanded to rejoice. It seems something we should have to do as a duty! But this is not what Paul meant. His intent was to warn his fellow Christians not to become immobilized by the fear of death. Nor were they to worry about the difficulties they would face in this world. Rather, they should take heart, knowing the Lord was near. And insofar as they could experience the Lord's nearness, Paul knew that joy would be born within them.

• Practice •

Begin your day by asking yourself this: What can I do today to bring someone joy? How can I be more joyful? Think about your own life. Surely you can imagine some act of joy you could do today that exceeds what might normally be expected of you. Perhaps this would be to visit someone you know, to reach to bring some small joy to a person in need, to call or send a note to a friend or acquaintance. In concrete ways like these, you can imagine, how you might live the joy of Advent in your own life?[Adapted from Your Light Gives Us Hope, 24 Daily Practices for Advent, Fr. 

Our current tables which are still useable will be kept and placed in storage for when we need tables for outside events [e.g., Covenant Sunday]. This will help us to rent fewer tables in the future and reduce annual expenses. The cost of a new table is \$438.57.
