





For relationships left in decay and neglect: **Come, Lord, and make all things new.**


For any action that has wounded us or by which we have wounded others:



The Virtue of Spirituality



In preparation for Advent Sacrament of Reconciliation, please prayerfully review the following examination of conscience.

- I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me. Have I treated people, events, or things as more important than God?
- You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain. Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?
- Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day. Do I go to Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of Obligation (Jan. 1; the Ascension; Aug. 15; Nov. 1; Dec. 8; Dec. 25)? Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body? Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday?
- Honor your father and your mother. Do I show my parents due respect? Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible? Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?
- You shall not kill. Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any kind?
- You shall not commit adultery. Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and of myself?
- You shall not steal. Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?
- You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?
- You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse. Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?
- You shall not covet your neighbor's goods. Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

St. Joseph the Steward

St. Joseph is one of the greatest examples of stewardship we have in the Gospels. Here is a man who understands care and reverence for the property of God, a man chosen to be

steward over the very life and breath of God's Son and Spouse.

Joseph was mindful. He recognized what belonged to God. When he understood that Mary was to be the mother of God, he was not jealous or bitter. He did not presume to claim ownership over her.

Joseph was prayerful. He accepted the opportunity to be in relationship with God, even if it was in a radical and unexpected way. ANNUAL CHRISTMAS GIFT TO OUR COMMUNITY: We depend very heavily on our annual Christmas collection. Our Christmas Collection helps us get off to a positive start for the new year. Because Christmas falls on a Sunday this year, all

offertory donations above our usual Sunday collection are considered our Christmas collection.

For example, if our usual Sunday collection is \$7,000, but the entire Christmas collection is \$50,000, this means that \$7,000 is taxable to the Archdiocese of Washington; \$43,000 is considered "exempt" from the usual diocesan tax and is retained for our own use at Jesus the Good Shepherd. It is only when Christmas falls on a day other than a Sunday that the *entire* Christmas collection is tax-exempt by the Archdiocese of Washington.

Because Christmas falls on a Sunday this year, some members of our community may be able to increase their Sunday offertory donation 15%. Whatever all households of our community can do to help make up this difference this year is greatly appreciated. Thank you for your prayerful consideration of this extraordinary request – due again to the fact that Christmas falls on a Sunday this year. God bless you!


