

UPDATE FROM THE FOOD PANTRY IN NORTH BEACH: Thank you for your generosity and ongoing support of the Ladies of Charity Food Pantry. In the month of November:

265 families served; 697 people served; 9,703.6 lbs. of food distributed

In addition, (not included in the above) we served the following in Thanksgiving groceries:

211 families; 578 people; 7,190.9 lbs. of food distributed

We especially are in need of cereal, canned fruit and peanut butter.
