



Liturgy of the Word

First Reading: Nehemiah 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10 Ezra the priest brought the law before the assembly, which consisted of men, women, and those children old enough to understand. Standing at one end of the open place that was before the Wahe read out of the book from daybreak till midday,

in the presence of the men, the women, and those children old enough to understand; and all the people listened attentively to the book of the law. Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden platform that had been made for the occasion. He opened the scroll so that all the people might see it — for he was standing higher up than any of the people —; and, as he opened it, all the people rose. Ezra blessed the

LORD, the great God, and all the people, their hands raised high, answered, "Amen, amen!" Then they bowed down and prostrated themselves before the LORD, their faces to the ground. Ezra read plainly from the book of the law of God, interpreting it so that all could understand what was read. Then Nehemiah, that is, His Excellency, and Ezra the

Brothers and sisters: As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit. Now the body is not a single part, but many. If a foot should say, "Because I am not a hand I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. Or if an ear should say, "Because I am not an eye I do

not belong to the body," it does not for

the whole body were an eye, where

this reason belong any less to the body. If

would the hearing be? If the whole body

smell be? But as it is, God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended. If they were all one part, where would the body be? But as it is, there are many parts, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I do not need you," nor again the head to the feet, "I do not need you." Indeed, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are all the more necessary, and those parts of the body that we consider less honorable we surround with greater honor, and our less presentable parts are treated with greater propriety, whereas our more presentable parts do not need this. But God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, so that there may be no

division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another.

If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy. Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it. Some people God has designated in the church to be, first, apostles; second, prophets; third, teachers; then, mighty deeds; then gifts of healing, assistance, administration, and varieties of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all

teachers? Do all work mighty deeds? Do all have gifts of healing?
Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret?

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us,







SYNOD, 2023

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

During our recent Christmas season, I hope you had the opportunity of being together with family and friends and connecting in some way with those who are not geographically close via social media. Those gatherings and social connections were opportunities to share what was happening in your life, and to hear what has been happening in others' lives.



Those conversations is what we will be doing here at Jesus the Good Shepherd in January and February. We will be encountering, listening and accompanying each other in what is called "synodality" — a process in which Pope Francis is asking Catholics throughout the world to participate *together* in order that we may provide our input into the World Synod of Bishops that will be held next year in 2023.

In our encounters with the Lord, He invites us to grow in our relationship with him, which is an occasion for grace and mercy to be experienced. That relationship strengthens us as we realize that God is always walking with us.

Here at Jesus the Good Shepherd, we already have a multitude of structures already in place that facilitate encounter. Our advisory bodies, ministry committees and organizations serve our community. All are asked to reflect upon issues and challenges in the parish, and to discern how our community can further the mission of the Church to teach, to answer the call to holiness, and to reach out in charity.

Pope Francis also exhorts us to reach out to those on the peripheries, those who might be further away from the heart of the Church. We are called to invite a wider circle of individuals to encounter the Church and be called to the center of Christ's love.

Pope Francis wants us to reflect on synodality, on how we accompany one another. We are called to mutually share burdens, listen to what is in each other's minds and hearts. Here are some random thoughts to get us thinking:

- How does JGS do as a welcoming community? Are we, in fact, welcoming?
- Do people know one another? How is a sense of family/community

nurtured? Might there be persons or groups left on the margins? How is JGS inviting those on the margins into community?

- Who does our "bigger" Church currently listen to? Who is not being listened to? Which groups are less likely to be listened to? Who is being left out of the conversation?
- Do our liturgies at JGS promote the active and participation of all the faithful in the liturgy and encourage them to live lives of faith? Does the homily draw from the Word of God and inspire the faithful?
- What areas and issues in the wider society is the Church focused on? Are there areas or issues we need to pay more attention to?

When our session and individual replies are submitted to the Archdiocese of Washington, the archdiocese will then compile the reflections of all the parishes. Then, the input from the archdiocese together with all the U.S. dioceses will be compiled by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. This final report will be sent to Rome where the summaries from throughout the world will serve as the basis for the World Synod of Bishops.

I invite you to participate locally by one of the two formats:

- <u>Listening Session, [in-person] Thursday, January 27, 6:30 9 p.m</u>.—in the Centre.
- Or, if you are not able to attend in person, individuals are invited to share electronically their feedback via the attached link: https://adw.org/2021-2023-synod-survey-for-individuals/; see 2021-2023 Synod Survey for Individuals. Online replies will be automatically sent to the Archdiocesan Synod Office. There, all replies will be compiled into the large Archdiocesan draft. This draft will then be shared at regional listening sessions throughout the Archdiocese.

I want to thank JGS members, Ernest and Charlene Cameron, in assisting me with this process. May we all recognize Christ in our midst, and may our encounter with Him strengthen our faith in that experience. May our hearts be enflamed with the desire to spread the Good News to all whom we encounter. God bless you!

PLEASE SLOW DOWN: Over the years, we have seen more traffic on our grounds due to the use of the pavilion, an increase in truck deliveries due to more "on-line" shopping, visits to our cemetery, a gradual return to more social activities at JGS and the regular, daily traffic patterns for Cardinal Hickey Academy. Unfortunately, there has

also been a simultaneous increase in speeding. This past summer saw some minor car accidents resulting in car damage, "rattled nerves," and the involvement of personal insurance companies of drivers.

To help remedy this situation, a few years ago more safety/caution signs were installed. Despite these words of caution and increase in number, there continues to be excessive speeding on parish grounds warranting further action. This action is being pro-active to address the future safety of all parishioners and visitors, especially the most vulnerable among us - our children, the disabled and the elderly.

As a result, speed bumps at four critical areas in our large parking lot are about to be installed. This action is being taken after consultation with and recommendation by Cardinal Hickey Academy, the Safety and Security Committee and the Stewardship Committee of JGS. There will be an evaluation to see if these few speedbumps will work in slowing down vehicles. Hopefully, this will sufficiently address the problem. Thank you for your cooperation in slowing down in general as you enter, park and leave our parking lot for the overall safety of all drivers and pedestrians.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

People can easily lose a sense of the sacred and transcendent. When we lose a sense of God's special presence, we need to be brought back. Ezra brought people back to the word of God and they realized what they were missing. Jesus proclaims

God's word in the synagogue with true conviction and tells those gathered that he is the fulfillment of all that Isaiah taught. Even though people get lost, distracted, discouraged, and often journey down the wrong path, God's timeless law remains. When we allow ourselves to truly hear God's word and act on it, that living word slowly, over time, changes us. It has the power to soften and mold us, creating within us a joyful spirit. We realize the truth in what God speaks and become open to God's love. Gradually and gently God leads us back where we belong. We discover again the sacred character of life and the wonder of God's power. It is no wonder that Luke addresses his remarks to Theophilus. It is a name that means "beloved of God," a name that can be used by anyone who desires friendship with God. ©LPi

This year, a specific goal was established: a much needed and updated state-of-the-art projector for the Centre. This was also advertised in our bulletin. A new projector will enhance

the livestream projection of Masses in the church into the Centre as well as be of great assistance to show PowerPoint presentations for ministerial and social events in the Centre. The goal was slightly over \$17,000. We are happy to report that this goal was reached and the new projector has been ordered. Delivery and installation are scheduled in about four weeks. We sincerely thank all who responded to our appeal on #iGiveCatholic Tuesday and in our bulletin!

MAJOR PROJECT FOR 2022 FOR THE **ENTIRE** JGS **COMMUNITY:** Since the 1990's, the Centre kitchen and restrooms have served faithfully for hundreds of all kinds of social activities. Due to age and much use, the restrooms in particular have become "old and tired!" With the support of our Stewardship Committee, a Centre Restrooms and Kitchen Renovation Committee was formed last fall to undertake the renovation of these two spaces. The Committee's major goals are:

- overall updating of our Centre Restrooms to make them more attractive and especially handicapped accessible;
- overall renovation of our Centre Kitchen, including updating the equipment, a better working space for food storage, food prep and food service, all in compliance with county health codes

The Committee has had several meetings and is currently working on the finalization of a draft of the entire plan to be shared with our entire community. This will give all a better appreciation of the substance of the Committee's discussions and its overall plan. Please stay tuned when this information becomes available and please keep this large project in your prayers. Thank you!


