Dear Brothers and Sisters,

When you come into our parking lot, you either see it or pass by it every time - CARDINAL HICKEY ACADEMY. Beginning this Sunday and during this week, the entire U.S. Catholic Church celebrates national CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK.

In talking to parishioners, I am always amazed at how many in our community attended Catholic elementary school, especially in the Archdiocese of Washington. More than that, I am always inspired in listening to

parishioners' stories of how much their Catholic elementary school education meant to them. They love to share stories and memories – both serious and silly – about their years in Catholic schools!

As we open Catholic Schools Week, I would like to share some facts about CHA. CHA is one of 66 Catholic elementary schools in the ADW. Locally, our current enrollment in CHA is 169 students, 46% of whom are from Jesus the Good Shepherd. The total number of students from JGS in CHA, ages 3-13, is about 16%. The remaining 84% of children in JGS either attend CCPS, other private schools or are home-schooled. The rest of the CHA student body comes primarily from Jesus the Divine Word, Huntingtown, St. Anthony of Padua, North Beach, Our Lady of Sorrows, West River, and Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Edgewater. CHA is about 88% Catholic and 12% Protestant/no church affiliation.

CHA is a regional school. This means that the parishes of Jesus the Good Shepherd, Jesus the Divine Word and St. Anthony are co-sponsors of the school. All the three pastors of these parishes, per policy of the Archdiocese of Washington, give 5% of their Sunday offertory to CHA. The donations are applied to tuition assistance for needy families. All three pastors sit on the various boards and committees of CHA which meet quite regularly. Yours truly, as pastor of the parish where CHA is located, serves also as the canonical administrator. I meet very regularly with the CHA principal and JGS parishioner, Mrs. Darlene Kostelnik. We address the many, daily tasks at hand as well as do some strategic planning. Darlene has proven to be an excellent gift to CHA as a skilled administrator, grant writer, substitute teacher, counselor to parents, staff and students. CHA is truly blessed to have such a wonderful, gifted and dedicated principal.

The primary mission of CHA, as is any Catholic school, is to teach and educate our children in the Catholic Faith, offer strong academics and instill in our students a love and passion to reach out to others and serve them as Jesus Himself did. PLEASE SLOW DOWN: Over the years, we have seen more traffic on our grounds due to the use of the pavilion, an increase in truck deliveries due to more "on-line" shopping, visits to our cemetery, a gradual return to more social activities at JGS and the regular, daily traffic patterns for Cardinal Hickey Academy. Unfortunately, there has

also been a simultaneous increase in speeding. This past summer saw some minor car accidents resulting in car damage, "rattled nerves," and the involvement of personal insurance companies of drivers.

To help remedy this situation, a few years ago more safety/caution signs were installed. Despite these words of caution and increase in number, there continues to be excessive speeding on parish grounds warranting further action. This action is being pro-active to address the future safety of all parishioners and visitors, especially the most vulnerable among us - our children, the disabled and the elderly.

As a result, speed bumps at four critical areas in our large parking lot are about to be installed. This action is being taken after consultation with and recommendation by Cardinal Hickey Academy, the Safety and Security Committee and the Stewardship Committee of JGS. There will be an evaluation to see if these few speedbumps will work in slowing down vehicles. Hopefully, this will sufficiently address the problem. Thank you for your cooperation in slowing down in general as you enter, park and leave our parking lot for the overall safety of all drivers and pedestrians.

#### LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Prophets possess an intimate knowledge of God and act on their experience of God. Prophetic messages usually challenge the status quo and draw us up and out of ourselves, focusing us on the bigger picture. We often think of ourselves and our own

needs first. When we listen to someone speak, we judge the merit of the message by its degree of usefulness. If the message or vision contains no personal benefit or profit but a call to stretch and grow, we can become indignant. Prophets are usually the ones whose message challenges us and calls us to see things differently and love more perfectly and deeply. God is love. When listening to St. Paul speak about love we witness the unfolding of this type of unconditional, other centered, self-sacrificial perfect God. It is an invitation to life, freedom, and happiness that can be offered to us only by God. Jesus, who is God and Love incarnate, calls us to this richer expression of love. #### Virtue of Stewardship

UPDATE ON #IGIVECATHOLIC: Giving Tuesday took place in early December. It was left to the parishes of the Archdiocese of Washington to participate. With the encouragement of our Stewardship/Finance Council, Jesus the Good Shepherd became one of only 59 out of 140 parishes who participated; we are very happy to report that Jesus the Good Shepherd ranked #5 of the 59 participating parishes in the amount given.



This year, a specific goal was established: a much needed and updated state-of-the-art projector for the Centre. This was also advertised in our bulletin. A new projector will enhance

the livestream projection of Masses in the church into the Centre as well as be of great assistance to show PowerPoint presentations for ministerial and social events in the Centre. The goal was slightly over \$17,000. We are happy to report that this goal was reached and the new projector has been ordered. Delivery and installation are scheduled in about four weeks. We sincerely thank all who responded to our appeal on #iGiveCatholic Tuesday and in our bulletin!

MAJOR PROJECT FOR 2022 FOR THE **ENTIRE** JGS **COMMUNITY:** Since the 1990's, the Centre kitchen and restrooms have served faithfully for hundreds of all kinds of social activities. Due to age and much use, the restrooms in particular have become "old and tired!" With the support of our Stewardship Committee, a Centre Restrooms and Kitchen Renovation Committee was formed last fall to undertake the renovation of these two spaces. The Committee's major goals are:

- overall updating of our Centre Restrooms to make them more attractive and especially handicapped accessible;
- overall renovation of our Centre Kitchen, including updating the equipment, a better working space for food storage, food prep and food service, all in compliance with county health codes

The Committee has had several meetings and is currently working on the finalization of a draft of the entire plan to be shared with our entire community. This will give all a better appreciation of the substance of the Committee's discussions and its overall plan. Please stay tuned when this information becomes available and please keep this large project in your prayers. Thank you!


