



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I hope this finds you well and staying healthy. As I write this, it seems that the news is "mixed" regarding the pandemic. On one hand, our health protocols seem to have positive results. In addition, the vaccine for COVID-19 is becoming more locally available. However, there are new strains or "variants" of the virus.



As I shared at the Masses last weekend, I was fortunate to have received several weeks ago the first of two of the vaccines for COVID-19. I receive the second vaccine in a couple of weeks. When I went for my vaccine, I found the process amazingly smooth and efficient. Second, my experience has been similar to others: I exhibited no symptoms and I had no, what is called, "after" effects. I highly recommend that you sign up for your vaccine to take advantage of it when it is your time to receive it.

As the old saying goes, "Patience is golden." There appears to be light at the end of the tunnel while we navigate the next month or two. We all need to continue to be patient. As St. Paul reminds us, "Love is patient; love is kind." When we are patient, we are more loving. And as the song goes that we occasionally sing at Mass, "They'll know we are Christians by our love."

As a community of faith, let us continue to pray for one another, for those who do have COVID-19 and those in our community who have lost loved ones because of the virus. We pray that God will give us peace as we stay close to Him in prayer and in the Eucharist – whether we celebrate Mass virtually or in person.

Let us pray. Jesus, Holy One of God, you cast out evil in today's Gospel. In so doing, you begin the kingdom of your Father. Inspire us to have faith and courage in the face of whatever evil today, including the pandemic, that confronts us. We draw our strength from you, our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

BLESSED PALM—It is a catholic tradition to gather blessed palm from past years and burn them, using the ashes for Ash Wednesday. This year, for health reasons, JGS will not be participating in this tradition. If you wish to dispose of blessed palms from your home, you may bury them or safely burn

them and spread the ashes outside.

THE CATHOLIC CHURCH SUPPORTS COVID-19 VACCINES: Both COVID vaccines of *Moderna* and *Pfizer* are in line with previous moral statements by Pope Benedict XVI and the Pontifical Council for Life. Receiving either vaccine is morally permissible and is certainly an important pro-life decision that would help to defend the most vulnerable members who are at the most risk of developing severe coronavirus cases. Because there is usually not a choice in the vaccine one receives when it becomes available, it is morally permissible to take the vaccine in order to protect the lives of those who are most at risk of serious coronavirus.

For those interested in more information, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith [CDF] published a statement on December 17, 2020 at the request of Pope Francis and he ordered its publication on the morality of using some anti-COVID 19 vaccines. It is available on the Vatican website. The statement reinforces material previously published by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops [USCCB] and the Catholic Health Association [CHA].

In addition, the Catholic bishops of Maryland, in a December 12, 2020 letter, strongly recommends all Catholics to receive the COVID-19 vaccines. The administration of the vaccines began December 14 to front-line health care workers across the nation and is also being administered to residents of long-term care facilities.

At this point in time, there is a significant amount of misinformation about the COVID-19 vaccines. In light of the teaching of the Catholic Church, all parishioners are strongly encouraged to consider the life-saving impact of the vaccine, and to receive the vaccine if and when they are able and when the vaccine becomes locally available.

The health protocol measures taken by Jesus the Good Shepherd [e.g., social-distancing, mask wearing, sign-ups at Masses for contact tracing, disinfecting after each Mass, etc.] as well as the new vaccines, will even more assist to protect the lives of all in our community, surrounding community and beyond.



POPE FRANCIS PROCLAIMS YEAR DEDICATED TO ST. JOSEPH: On December 8, 2020, the Holy Father proclaimed a yearlong celebration dedicated to the foster father of Jesus. The pope said Christians can discover in St. Joseph, who often goes unnoticed, "an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble."

NEW STIMULUS BILL CONTAINS PROVISIONS THAT WILL HELP IMMI-GRANT FAMILIES WHERE AT LEAST ONE ADULT HAS A SOCIAL SECURITY

NUMBER. The stimulus bill signed into law late December allows stimulus funds to be given to families where at least one adult has a Social Security number. (Families with one parent with Social Security and one without documents were denied stimulus funds last year.) The new Economic Impact Payments authorizes not only the \$600 stimulus for an adult this year, but enables families to retroactively receive the \$1200 from last year.

Parishioners who need assistance to claim these benefits are invited to email the Catholic Charities VITA program. Because we love our neighbor, JGS has been operating at a capacity of 25% in the church.



Even though our max capacity is 500, given the shape of the venue, and the pews, we could not safely increase our capacity beyond 125 while keeping 6-ft distances.




