





Dear Brothers and Sisters.

It is hard for me, at least, to believe we are almost half-way through February. So many good things are on the horizon – especially the beginning of Lent, Wednesday, February 22nd.

In his recent general audience on January 18, the words of Pope Francis struck me: to be pastoral, we must always look to the "Good Shepherd." The Holy Father's words have special meaning for us as members of Jesus the Good Shepherd.

Pope Francis said, "By being with Jesus, we discover that his pastoral heart always beats for the person who is confused, lost, far away . . . Jesus never said, 'Let them sort themselves out,' he went to find them."

The Holy Father encouraged Christians to model themselves on Jesus, the Good Shepherd, longing for those who have left the Church, just as a shepherd longs for lost sheep, rather than treating them as "adversaries" or "enemies." He invites us to reflect on how God seeks out those who distance themselves from him: "The Lord suffers most when we distance ourselves from his heart, but in response to this suffering he does not withdraw, rather he risks. He leaves the ninety-nine sheep who are safe and ventures out for the lost one."

How wonderful if it would be if EACH one of us REACHES out to just one person who feels distant from Christ and/or distant from the Church. Who knows? By our personal invitation, even to a stranger, we can be ambassadors for Christ and welcome every person into the Church, the family of God, and to Jesus the Good Shepherd Catholic Community. God bless you!

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDER-STANDING OF SCRIPTURE

It's often said that the Catholic Church lays heavy rules on her members, rules that can almost seem impossible. Mass every



Sunday? No lying ever? Sexual purity all the time? I recently said to some non-Catholic friends that more than fifty adults were baptized at my parish at the Easter Vigil. One responded spontaneously with shock, "Why would anyone do that?" In other words, why would someone willingly place themselves in a system with such demanding and rigorous rules?

Of course, no one in the history of religions is more demanding and rigorous than Jesus himself. In the Sermon on the Mount, he says you have to be holier than pharisees or you're out. He says if you call someone a fool, you go to fiery Gehenna. He says you can't even look at a woman with lust or you're guilty of adultery (which was punishable by death). To top it all off, he says you can't even get divorced and re-married. Doesn't he know these are basically impossible demands? What world is he living in?

The new one, actually. He is the new world. Jesus' words aren't meant to condemn. They are meant to signal something new, a restored humanity. Jesus doesn't just give external laws; he gives us his Holy Spirit to internalize the law through love. He wants to fill us with his love. That's what the Church exists to do. Love demands extraordinary things. The "demands" of the Church only make sense because she is filled with Jesus' love. That wildly demanding love is why we are Catholic. — Father John Muir **©LPi**





CELEBRATING BLACK HISTORY MONTH—Father Augustus Tolton (1854 – 1897) was the first Roman Catholic priest in the United States publicly known to be black. A former slave who was baptized and reared Catholic, Tolton studied formally in Rome since no American seminary would accept him because of his race. He was ordained in 1886.

He was assigned to the diocese of Alton (now

Springfield) and first ministered to his home parish in Quincy, Illinois. Tolton eventually was sent to Chicago, where he ran development and construction of St. Monica's Catholic Church as a black national parish church. The church was never completed beyond the first level, and Fr. Tolton incurred an untimely death on July 9, 1897. To read Father Tolton's complete biography, click here.

UP FOR CANONIZATION: In 2010, Cardinal Francis George announced the Augustus Tolton cause for canonization for sainthood.

Most recently, on June 11, 2019, Pope Francis advanced the Cause for Sainthood of The Servant of God Augustus Tolton by signing a decree issued by the Vatican Congregation for the Causes of Saints. Upon the declaration of this decree by the Pope, Tolton is deemed "Venerable" which formally means he lived the theological virtues of faith, hope and charity and the cardinal virtues of prudence, justice, fortitude and temperance at a heroic level. OLD JGS RECTORY/NEW OWNERS: We are happy to report that the old rectory for Jesus the Good Shepherd on W. Mount Harmony Road was officially sold to new owners in early February. The old rectory served as the "basis" for the beginning of Jesus the Good Shepherd in the mid-1980's. When nothing else existed on our present campus, one might say that the original rectory was the "starter kit" for JGS! Some of our senior members will happily recall its use and the memories contained therein. It is amazing, since that time, how much our campus has grown – it is now just under 60 acres – praise God. So, with the old rectory sold, another "page" of the rich history of Jesus the Good Shepherd has now been turned. As a parish which strongly upholds the virtue of hospitality, we want to welcome our new neighbors to what was the "old rectory." 




