

WHAT IS THE RITE OF ENROLLMENT?

This rite mirrors the process of the RCIA, or Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. In Confirmation preparation, the Rite of Enrollment marks the end of the **Period of Formation** during which the candidates have focused on Jesus and the gospels and responding to their call to discipleship. The focus of this final stage of preparation, the **Period of Reflection**, shifts to Roman Catholicism, its beliefs and practices. Because we love our neighbor, JGS has been operating at a capacity of 25% in the church.


