WHAT IS THE RITE OF ENROLLMENT?

This rite mirrors the process of the RCIA, or Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. In Confirmation preparation, the Rite of Enrollment marks the end of the **Period of Formation** during which the candidates have focused on Jesus and the gospels and responding to their call to discipleship. The focus of this final stage of preparation, the **Period of Reflection**, shifts to Roman Catholicism, its beliefs and practices. The Rite this evening provides an opportunity for the candidates to publicly express their desire for Confirmation and to call the broader community to recognize the responsibilities that come with acceptance of these candidates.

COVID-19 UPDATE

Because we love our neighbor, JGS has been operating at a capacity of 25% in the church.



Even though our max capacity is 500, given the shape of the venue, and the pews, we could not safely increase our capacity beyond 125 while keeping 6-ft distances.
