

#### Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This past weekend was Commitment Weekend for the Annual Appeal. As I shared at all the Masses, I am very happy to report that for 2022, Jesus the Good Shepherd not just made its goal but surpassed it! Out of 140 parishes only about one-third either met or surpassed their goal. Thanks to your charity and generosity, our community was one of them!

Personally, I am a strong supporter of the Annual Appeal. The Annual Appeal goes to so many worthwhile causes throughout the Archdiocese. We, in fact, are also recipients of the Appeal. For example, we are blessed with one permanent deacon but we have three men from our community currently in formation. This program needs funds to operate. Archdiocesan workshops for the formation of our catechists and liturgical ministries are funded by the Appeal. Tuition Assistance to needy families who wish to send their children to Cardinal Hickey Academy is also funded by the Annual Appeal.

Campus ministries, such the Catholic Student Center at the University of Maryland, are funded by the Appeal. The list goes on and on. We can take great pride in the great outreach programs in the District of Columbia and the five surrounding counties of Maryland that benefit from the Annual Appeal.

The archdiocese is also blessed with 80 seminarians preparing to become priests someday. You can imagine the cost of sending just one to college but if you multiply that by 80, the costs are staggering. The Appeal supports the costs of funding our seminarians to eventually become priests for the archdiocese.

All in our community are blessed in some way. Our goal for 2023 assigned by the Archdiocese is \$109,000. This is a large goal by any standard. But if every household makes a sacrificial gift to support the Annual Appeal and its many ministries, I am confident that once again we can make our goal. As in every year, 100% of your gift to the Appeal is restricted solely to the ministries that are part of the Annual Appeal and cannot be used for any other purpose. Your sacrificial gift will be credited towards our parish goal.

Thank you again in advance for prayerfully considering your commitment to the 2023 Annual Appeal. Your sense of charity and generosity are not only a source of inspiration for me but a sign of your commitment to our brothers and sisters, the Body of Christ, throughout the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Washington. 



## GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

#### 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Of all the things Jesus says which seem totally bat-crazy, this one might take the cake: "But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you." An enemy is someone who desires the destruction of you, your projects, or those you care about. To love and pray for them is to want their health, strength, and flourishing. But if they thrive, they are more likely to hurt you and others. So, aren't you indirectly willing your own destruction, or that of your friends? If you doubt that this problem is embedded in this teaching, when was the last time you actually prayed honestly for the people you really hate?

How can we solve this riddle so we might actually live this command? Recall that enemy-love is the surest sign that you love someone with God's love, and not with indirect egotism. After all, if my love for my enemy ends up hurting me or my loved ones, it can't be for me. Enemy-love costs more because there are no tit-for-tats. No reciprocity — just loved poured out, and often pain in return. That's why it is so precious and rare. "What is unusual about that?" asks the Lord about love for our friends. Jesus wants us to experience the unusual love which only comes from him.

When Jesus was being killed on the cross, he was loving his executioners. In fact, he was holding them in being as they nailed him to the cross. He loved those who were spiritually piercing his Mother's heart, while they were doing it. And when he rose from the dead, he showed us that this kind of love is always worth it. It's stronger than death. Real love is unusual.
