

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We are certainly blessed with a lot of wonderful activity at this time of year!

This week begins Lent. I hope you have had a chance to review the LENTEN GUIDE 2020 we gave out in the bulletins last week.



Copies are also available in the atrium at your convenience. All the principal events and liturgies through Easter are given prominent attention.

As you read this, this weekend is the annual Men's Club-sponsored retreat for all men of our community. It is always very popular - so popular that Jesus the Good Shepherd traditionally "fills" the Loyola Retreat House in Charles County! We are one of the very few parishes that do this. 



Friday Night Stations of the Cross and Simple Suppers



All are welcome, every Friday evening for Stations of the Cross at 6:00 p.m., followed by a Simple Supper (a meatless meal) sponsored by the JGS Confirmation teens.

The Stations of the Cross commemorate the stops in Jerusalem along Jesus' journey in Jerusalem from the Court of Pontius Pilate where he was condemned to death to Mount Calvery where he was crucified. Mary, the mother of Jesus, is believed to have often retraced the sorrowful journey her Son made on that Good Friday. From that time on, the Stations have been a strong Catholic devotion on the Fridays of Lent to serve as a reminder how special Good Friday is in the life of Jesus and in our lives as well.

A Lenten Chant Mass Setting

Through Lent the Music Ministry will be introducing a mass setting called "The Belmont Mass: A chant mass for the people of God." This setting is by Christopher Walker, and is in memory of a Benedictine monk in Belmont Abbey, England. It is very accessible because it is chant in English and can be accompanied or unaccompanied. During the season of Lent, we take time for penitence, simplicity, and unity, which this mass setting fully embraces. We will continue the Kyrie and Agnus Dei from the Roman Missal Latin Chant, but the Holy, Mystery of Faith, and Great Amen will be in English from the Belmont Mass. This will complete our parish cycle of having 4 different seasonal Mass parts for Advent/Christmas, Ordinary Times, Lent and Easter. This is all possible because of YOU! As an Assembly, YOU at Jesus the Good Shepherd value singing as a supreme form of prayer and praise! Thank you for all of your participation within this musical cycle during our Liturgical Year!

Liturgical Lent Trivia!

"313... the organ and other musical instruments should be used with a moderation that is consistent with the season's character and does not anticipate the full joy of the Nativity of the Lord. In Lent the playing of the organ and musical instruments is allowed only to support the singing. Exceptions are Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent), Solemnities, and Feasts." – General Instruction for the Roman Missal.

During Lent, the church wants us to use instruments with moderation and consistent with the season's character. While the organ's main focus is the support of the singing, there is an omission of solos during the Prelude,

Offertory, and Postlude. Watch for this change within our own church and embrace the silence that Lent can bring for a conversation with Christ.

Safety and Security—February Message

Like everywhere else, JGS is in the middle of the cold and flu season. In these times it best to avoid close contact with people who are sick and if you are sick, remember others.
