








February 27, 2022 The Eighth Sunday of Ordinary Time





Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This last weekend of February means it is soon the beginning of March and the beginning of Lent next week! Enclosed in our bulletin is our annual *Lent Booklet*. I hope you will keep this handy and look at it occasionally for the many opportunities you can take advantage of during Lent to draw closer to Christ. My deepest thanks for all the staff for their contributions and editing. Many hours went into this booklet.



This coming week, our Shrove Tuesday [Mardi Gras] Pancake Dinner is always a fun event for our community the day before Ash Wednesday. On Ash Wednesday we have four Masses for the blessing and distribution of ashes. I do hope you will make every effort to put aside an hour for Mass to receive your ashes on Ash Wednesday.

I want to sincerely thank all those who have made a pledge so far to the 2022 *Annual Appeal*. The Appeal is SO important for the continuation of many ministries within our Archdiocese. Two weekends ago we had two permanent deacons from the Office of the Permanent Diaconate share how the Appeal supports their formation program and after-ordination programs. Last weekend, Cardinal Gregory in his pre-recorded homily played at all the Masses stressed the importance of the Appeal from his perspective as our archbishop. This weekend we are blessed with a seminarian from the Archdiocese. Our formation of future priests, too, is funded by the Appeal. God knows we need priests! Your financial support funds their seminary education and formation.

In light of today's Gospel, it is easy to think of ourselves using another of Jesus' "plant metaphors:" we may have a few barren branches, but those are being trimmed so that we can bear more fruit.

Yet when we look at other people, we do not always judge branch by branch; we see them as just a good tree or a bad tree. Each of us is indeed judged by our own fruit – as we will be by the Just Judge whom we will one day face. If we examine ourselves honestly today, what kind of tree do you see?

Let us pray. God of the vineyard, you oversee everything that grows and the fruit that it bears. Grant that our works may produce only that which is good and pleasing in your sight, and accept our lives during this coming Lent as a fruitful offering to you. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

My prayers are with you as we embark on the 40-day Season-Retreat of Lent. God bless you!




