

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

What a wonderful weekend we had last weekend! On Saturday, we had our annual retreat called JESUS DAY for all of our young people who are preparing for their First Eucharist this spring.

As always, it was a wonderful experience for them, their parents and for me! There are four different "sections" of the retreat: Sacred Space, Banners of Faith, Religious Scavenger Hunt and Reconciliation. It was great to see the children get so engaged and excited about spiritual things. And not a few parents came up to me afterward and said, "Father, I didn't know that!"

As adults, we are all called to learn more and deepen our Catholic faith. But this is also how we pass on our Catholic Faith to the next generation. Faith is not just "taught." It is "caught." Are we so excited about our faith that we want to pass on the Good News to our children, to our next generation, to our non-Catholic neighbors, our friends?

Last Saturday evening, we had a wonderful dinner sponsored by the Men's Club of our community. It was the largest turnout ever! On Sunday at the 8 and 10:45 a.m. Masses, we celebrated the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord with the distribution and blessing of candles. At the latter Mass, the children's choir united with the adult choir and some instrumentalists. What a beautiful and moving Mass that was in particular.

In our Gospel today, Jesus uses two "home" images: "salt" and "light." He uses such to teach the disciples how important they are in sharing his mission. Notice that Jesus uses the emphatic phrasing: "You are . . . " Not you can be, or you might be, or maybe you will be.

No, He is very direct in naming them as salt and light, they are "change" agents. Just as salt adds flavor to food and light dispels the darkness, so will they transform the world by their witness and their good deeds. In accepting this identity, we bring glory to God.

Let us pray. You have sent us your Son, O God, to be a light for the nations and a savior of all people. Grant to us an untiring spirit that we might transform the darkness of this world by actions that are just and merciful. May our light reflect that of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen!





A Lenten Chant Mass Setting

Through Lent the Music Ministry will be introducing a mass setting called "The Belmont Mass: A chant mass for the people of God." This setting is by Christopher Walker, and is in memory of a Benedictine monk in Belmont Abbey, England. It is very accessible because it is chant in English and can be accompanied or unaccompanied. During the season of Lent, we take time for penitence, simplicity, and unity, which this mass setting fully embraces. We will continue the Kyrie and Agnus Dei from the Roman Missal Latin Chant, but the Holy, Mystery of Faith, and Great Amen will be in English from the Belmont Mass. This will complete our parish cycle of having 4 different seasonal Mass parts for Advent/Christmas, Ordinary Times, Lent and Easter. This is all possible because of YOU! As an Assembly, YOU at Jesus the Good Shepherd value singing as a supreme form of prayer and praise! Thank you for all of your participation within this musical cycle during our Liturgical Year!

Liturgical Lent Trivia!

"313... the organ and other musical instruments should be used with a moderation that is consistent with the season's character and does not anticipate the full joy of the Nativity of the Lord. In Lent the playing of the organ and musical instruments is allowed only to support the singing. Exceptions are Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent), Solemnities, and Feasts." — General Instruction for the Roman Missal.

During Lent, the church wants us to use instruments with moderation and consistent with the season's character. While the organ's main focus is the support of the singing, there is an omission of solos during the Prelude, Offertory, and Postlude. Watch for this change within our own church and embrace the silence that Lent can bring for a conversation with Christ.


