



First Reading: 2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem. Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled." In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of

the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!"





Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Lenten blessings be upon you! In addition to the warmer temperatures we have been experiencing, there are even more signs that spring is on its way. We are also only two weeks away from Palm/Passion Sunday and three weeks away from Easter!



This coming Wednesday is the *Memorial of St. Patrick*. Legends or "stories" about Patrick abound; but truth is best served by our seeing two solid qualities in him: Patrick was humble and he was courageous. What two qualities to imitate! What distinguishes Patrick is the perseverance of his efforts. When one considers the state of Ireland when he began his mission work, the vast extent of his labors [all of Ireland] and how the seeds he planted continued to grow and flourish, one can only admire the kind of man Patrick must have been. So, happy St. Patrick's Day!

This coming Friday, the Church celebrates the *Solemnity of St. Joseph*, spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and foster father of Jesus. While St. Joseph is not mentioned frequently in the Gospel, his presence was essential to God's plan of salvation. He acted as the protector and guide of Jesus. He followed God's command and allowed God to work in and through his life. He is also the patron saint of a happy death, as tradition holds that he was surrounded by the Blessed Virgin Mary at the time of his death. St. Joseph is also patron saint of workers, immigrants and fathers. Happy St. Joseph's Day!



Let us pray. Loving God, you bless us this week with the feasts of two great Saints – Patrick and Joseph. They remained guided in this life by the light and love of your son, Jesus. Because we love our neighbor, JGS has been operating at a capacity of 25% in the church.
