Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I pray that you are having a spiritually rewarding Lent. Of late, I have been very encouraged by the participation of so many in our Lenten events: Ash Wednesday Mass attendance, the Saturday Night Dinner hosted by the Men's Club, the teens at our Confirmation Retreat, the parent meeting for our children preparing for their First Eucharist this spring, the turnout for Confessions on Wednesday evenings and Saturday afternoons, the great



attendance at the Friday night Mass at 6 p.m., followed by our simple suppers and Stations of the Cross.

We also had a nice group from our RCIA participate at the Rite of Election last Sunday at the Basilica in Washington, where they were formally chosen by Cardinal Gregory for the Easter Sacraments on Holy Saturday. I already look forward with excitement to our Holy Saturday Easter Vigil Mass! As of this writing, the Lent Mission has not yet taken place, but I am very hopeful for a great attendance.

An extra "blessing" this Lent has been the installation of the new outdoor statue of St. Joseph. After many delays due to the pandemic, it got installed just in time for the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Saturday, March 19 [moral of story: it's God time, everything DOES work out!]. This statue came about as a blessing from the "Year of St. Joseph" proclaimed last year by Pope Francis. A family in our community took notice of the prayer to St. Joseph in the bulletin and made this extraordinary donation to our community. As soon as warm weather returns permanently, there will be some modest landscaping done around the base of the statue to highlight it. St. Joseph, patron of the universal Church, pray for us! Protect the suffering of Ukraine in particular! In this Sunday's gospel, we hear a parable from Jesus about growth. It is a reminder to attend to what we want to grow and be fruitful. Growth and bearing fruit take time – often painfully. We have to remind ourselves of this fact in our daily living. Sometimes we grow frustrated at the lack of growth. Some things blossom without much attention; other things need cultivation and encouragement.

What are YOU cultivating this Lent? Is what we are growing bearing fruit? Will it do so in the future? Do we have the courage to cut out what is not bearing fruit? If we have given time and attention to something, it can be difficult to let it go if it's not working. But perhaps what takes root in its place will bear much fruit.

Let us pray. God you have given us many gifts. Help us to attend to them and grow them with care, that we may bear fruit for your kingdom. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

May God continue to bless your sacrifices during this Lent and make them bear much fruit!

ANNUNCATION

SOLEMNITY OF THE ANNUNCIATION—The Solemnity of the Annunciation falls on <u>Friday, March 25 this year</u>. Since it is a solemnity, the precept that those who are fourteen and older abstain from meat on Fridays of Lent does not apply.



With the pandemic restrictions being lifted, the JGS choir fulfills its dream of singing at Carnegie Hall in New York City. The JGS Choir is one of many choirs nationally that were invited for the concert produced by Distinguished Concerts International of New York (DCINY). The choirs

range from civic to philharmonic and are traveling from Washington state to Vancouver to Richmond. Jesus the Good Shepherd is the only local choir to go from Maryland and the only one in the Archdiocese of Washington to attend. This will be the first large choral work that DCINY has produced at Carnegie Hall in over two years.

Confession Question:

RECONCILIATION

If God knows everything we do, why do we need to go to Confession?

Answer:

Another term for the Sacrament of Confession is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We go to this sacrament not only to confess our sins, but to be reconciled with God. Of course, this begs the question, "If I can pray to God on my own, why can't I be reconciled to God on my own?" In the seven sacraments, we recognize the importance of community. Sacraments like baptism or matrimony happen in the context of the wider church to remind us of the communal impact of our lives. We are not alone in our walk of faith!

We don't need to confess our sins in front of the whole community – thank God! But going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a tangible reminder that our sins affect not only ourselves and our relationship with God, but others as well. Jesus gave his Apostles authority to forgive sins in his name. Through this sacrament, we are really, truly forgiven by God Himself. We receive an outpouring of grace and strength to sin no more and our relationship with Christ and his Body, the Church, are restored. ©LPi


