



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As I write this, we all face the unpredictability and seriousness of the coronavirus pandemic. Undoubtedly, it is a time of uncertainty, for some even anxiety. As Catholics, what should our response be?



First, we need to be vigilant with our God-given intellect. The current atmosphere calls upon all of us to use reason. Reason tells us that we should be prudent, listen and follow the many health precautions recommended by science and by medical professionals.

At the same time, our Catholic faith is a powerful anchor during these times. Our faith makes clear that God is our all-powerful Creator and that God is more powerful than any natural force, illness or economic setback. Perhaps some are concerned about all three. This is only natural, but we are called at this time in our lives to still be people of *faith*, not of fear.

In times of uncertainty and anxiousness, PRAYER has always been for Christ and His Church the most important response. Ironically, the pandemic coincides with our Season of Lent. This season calls all of us to reconsider our relationships with God and neighbor and to take time for introspection and improvement of those relationships. This seems particularly appropriate at this time.

As people of faith during this time, let us pray. Daily, we should be praying with/for our families and with/for our greater parish family of Jesus the Good Shepherd. I recommend, for example, that all in our community pray for one another every night at 7 p.m. the *Prayer for Protection in time of Pandemic*, posted in this bulletin and in our *Flocknotes*. Perhaps this could also be followed by a recitation of the Rosary, either with family members or by oneself.

Monday through Fridays, we offer Eucharistic Adoration in the church, during which time we offer expanded times for the Sacrament of Reconciliation/Penance, 10 - 11 a.m. in addition to the other times already publicized in our *Lenten Guide 2020, Flocknotes*, website and bulletin.

Please be assured of my daily prayers for you and for our community as we navigate this unusual challenge in our journey of faith. Please keep me in yours. God bless you!


