





Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It is hard to believe [at least for me!] that next weekend is the beginning of Holy Week -- Palm Sunday! And two weeks from this weekend is Easter!

I was struck by today's second reading from St. Paul to the Romans. The reading compels us to look at our material wealth – "those who are in the flesh" –- to redistribute it and share it with all. So often we concern ourselves only with having enough material satisfaction – we want the latest, the greatest and the best.

Paul challenges us to live in a way where we share lavishly and without fear of what will happen next. We live in a consumer culture which pushes us to acquire material goods for ourselves without asking if we have enough.

There is no doubt that people in our world are suffering on many levels. Perhaps it might be time to give up some material security and live in the hope of new life, life in Christ Jesus.

Let us pray. Lord Jesus, many times people who live without enough resources find hope in the resurrection, knowing temporal needs of this world are but fleeting in your kingdom. Stir in us during these remaining days of Lent the desire and energy to bring your kingdom here, sharing our resources broadly to all people while also hoping in the world that is yet to come. You live and reign for ever and ever. Amen!





RESUMPTION OF THE RECEPTION OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD AT MASS: Cardinal Gregory has recently extended permission to the pastors of the Archdiocese of Washington if they wish to allow the resumption of Communion from the Cup at Mass beginning Holy Thursday.

After consultation, I am very pleased to

announce that Jesus the Good Shepherd will do so. Kindly keep in mind, even prior to the pandemic, that this practice continues to be an option of the communicant and not a requirement. Certainly, if you have a cold, etc., it would be better to continue to refrain from the cup.

Holy Thursday, when the Church commemorates the institution of the Lord's Supper, is a most appropriate occasion to bring back this time-honored tradition, restored as one of the many fruits of the liturgical reform of the Second Vatican Council. To be able to receive both the true Body and Blood at Mass is such a beautiful expression of our belief in the Real Presence, especially in this time of Eucharistic Revival. For this gift of the Blood of Christ, together with His Body, let us give thanks to God and rejoice!

Sunday, March 26, 2023 Do You Believe This?

Today's readings: Ezekiel 37:12–14; Psalm 130:1–2, 3–4, 5–6, 7–8; Romans 8:8–11; John 11:1–45. The readings from the Gospel of John proclaimed on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent are explicitly tied to the scrutiny rites celebrated with those preparing for baptism at Easter. Throughout Lent, the assembly participates in these rites that are part of the process of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. The assembly, too, benefits spiritually as all pray that the candidates be enlightened with a deeper knowledge of Christ and purified from anything that blocks their full assent of belief. Those seeking baptism are preparing to approach the font and make a profession of faith in front of the community. Simultaneously, the rest of us are preparing to renew our baptismal promises with full hearts. These Gospel accounts guide us so that we may hear and believe (like the Samaritan woman), see and believe (like the man born blind), and finally believe without proof (like Martha, Mary, and Lazarus). In each of these Gospels, Jesus reveals his true identity. They culminate in the exchange between Jesus and Martha on the road to Bethany. Jesus proclaims to Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life" (John 11:25) and then asks Martha, "Do you believe this?"

This final week of Lent invites us to join those preparing for baptism in prayer and reflection. Are you ready to affirm with Martha: "Yes, Lord, I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world" (John 11:27)?
