





With today's celebration of Palm Sunday, Holy Week begins. Why is this week called HOLY? This is the holiest week of the year, a time of keeping vigil. Holy Week demands more of us than vigilance alone. So often, we see Holy Week as a time for taking a break from school and work and are



thinking of plans after Easter. Yet, the liturgies of Palm Sunday today and the Triduum [the three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday] later this week call us as Christians to walk a little closer with Jesus. We are reminded that we do not just stand under the cross; we are called to take up our cross – whatever it may be – and follow. We do not simply keep watch at the tomb; we also go INTO the tomb to be buried with Christ. When parents go somewhere, children often ask: "Can I go with you?" Then, when they get tired or bored, they ask to be taken home because the trip is too long or hard. Holy Week invites us as God's children to follow Jesus to the very end so that we may never walk in darkness but rise with Him to eternal life! "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen" [Luke 24:5]. I look forward to your presence and participation in our liturgies of Holy Week.

Let us pray. God our Father, as we enter Holy Week, just as your Son, Jesus, claimed his authority over Jerusalem, so he enters our own hearts in order to guide and govern us. May our Lord Jesus Christ reign triumphant in all that we do and in every moment of our lives, for He lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen!



After 22 years in Rome, Paulist Father Greg Apparcel recently moved to Washington DC to be the new Director of Formation at the Paulist Seminary. Father Greg

entered the Paulist seminary in 1978. Having earned an M.A. in Theology from the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., Father Greg was ordained a priest on May 21, 1983 and has served in many capacities all over the U.S. and Rome. He served as Chaplain at Clemson University, SC; as assistant pastor at Old St. Mary's Church in San Francisco; and, assisted Paulist Productions by working with film and t.v. writers.

In Rome he served as the Vice-Rector and then the Rector of Santa Susanna, a position he held from 2004 until October, 2020. During that time, he also served as Chaplain to Marymount International School of Rome (pre-K to Senior High School), ministering to its 700+ students and their families.
