



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I have always enjoyed Lent. It is a six-week journey into what I call "the great empty!" It is like a wide-open desert lying before us – in seeking out the Lord and asking what we may do for his sake and whereby we meet our authentic selves.



"This is the great secret of the season: you keep going, even though it is hard and you feel like you've been here before, and you're slipping in the sand and getting nowhere. But suddenly, if you are looking for them, the blessings and graces you've already been given become apparent and the Promised Land of further graces becomes enlarged in your sight, and everything . . . begins to make sense" [E. Scalia, Finding Joy in Lent].

Today's Gospel is on the Transfiguration of Jesus. God bestowed on Jesus an identity of "my beloved." From the moment of our Baptism, we too are named the beloved of God. The voice from the cloud urges the disciples to "listen to him." When we hear and follow the word of the Lord, we live as the beloved of God.

Let us pray. Loving God, you bestowed on your beloved Son the power of your word and the spirit of your mercy. Grant us, your servants, the wisdom of your Eternal Word and the perseverance of the first disciples. May our Lenten works transform our hearts and bring glory to your Son. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.



The Stations of the Cross commemorate the stops in Jerusalem along Jesus' journey in Jerusalem from the Court of Pontius Pilate where he was condemned to death to Mount Calvery where he was crucified. Mary, the mother of Jesus, is believed to have often retraced the sorrowful journey her Son made on that Good Friday. From that time on, the Stations have been a strong Catholic devotion on the Fridays of Lent to serve as a reminder how special Good Friday is in the life of Jesus and in our lives as well.

A Lenten Chant Mass Setting

Through Lent the Music Ministry will be introducing a mass setting called "The Belmont Mass: A chant mass for the people of God." This setting is by Christopher Walker, and is in memory of a Benedictine monk in Belmont Abbey, England. It is very accessible because it is chant in English and can be accompanied or unaccompanied. During the season of Lent, we take time for penitence, simplicity, and unity, which this mass setting fully embraces. We will continue the Kyrie and Agnus Dei from the Roman Missal Latin Chant, but the Holy, Mystery of Faith, and Great Amen will be in English from the Belmont Mass. This will complete our parish cycle of having 4 different seasonal Mass parts for Advent/Christmas, Ordinary Times, Lent and Easter. This is all possible because of YOU! As an Assembly, YOU at Jesus the Good Shepherd value singing as a supreme form of prayer and praise! Thank you for all of your participation within this musical cycle during our Liturgical Year!

Liturgical Lent Trivia!

"313... the organ and other musical instruments should be used with a moderation that is consistent with the season's character and does not anticipate the full joy of the Nativity of the Lord. In Lent the playing of the organ and musical instruments is allowed only to support the singing. Exceptions are Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent), Solemnities, and Feasts." — General Instruction for the Roman Missal.

During Lent, the church wants us to use instruments with moderation and consistent with the season's character. While the organ's main focus is the support of the singing, there is an omission of solos during the Prelude, Offertory, and Postlude. Watch for this change within our own church and embrace the silence that Lent can bring for a conversation with Christ.


