and the sharing of his sufferings by being conformed to his death,


if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.





Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Next weekend, we begin Holy Week - the holiest week of the Year. I hope that you clear your calendar and appreciate the beauty of the Holy Week liturgies. The liturgies draw us closer to Christ and enable us to be His presence in our fragile world. Please make every effort and plan to be present for our beautiful Holy Week celebrations at Jesus the Good Shepherd. I am sure all of us have gotten distracted at some



point. We have a lot on our minds and

unintentionally forgot to do or to say something. It is not often we see Jesus in the Gospel distracted. It's one of the best qualities about him: he seems very attentive to the people around him all the time.

But here he is in today's Gospel, drawing in the dirt of all things, seemingly surprised when near him, a woman has not been stoned or condemned. We do not know what Jesus wrote on the ground, what so absorbed his attention that he didn't notice the crowd leave.

And it wasn't just "any" crowd: they had stones ready to be thrown. His distraction diffuses the tension, though. He doesn't give the sin attention. By so doing, he creates "space" for mercy.

Let us pray. Loving God, your Son, Jesus, brought mercy to all kinds of situations. He showed us how to act justly and walk humbly. May we follow his example and create space for mercy and justice in all that we do. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

May God's blessings be upon you this Fifth Week of Lent!


