


Liturgy of the Word

First Reading: Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

When they had gathered together they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He answered them, "It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven."





All the children of our parish are invited to participate in the Summer Mission Vacation Bible School that will take place on campus from June 21 through June 25. We can't wait to serve you! Spotlight On: CHRISTMAS IN APRIL—coordinator Randy Kozik What does this ministry do? Repairs and improve houses of low-income homeowners to ensure they and their families can live in warmth, safety, and independence.

What initially drew you to this ministry? As a new Calvert County teacher back in the 80s, I quickly became aware of the economic contrasts of my students with the most glaring being their housing: some with "outhouses", shallow well pumps, kerosene furnaces or woodburning stoves in the middle of the main room of the house.

What do you love /enjoy most about this ministry? I love seeing the appreciative smiles and sometimes tears of homeowners, the camaraderie and teamwork of volunteers, the witnessing and participation of reaching out to help a neighbor.

The ministry is great for anyone who wants to improve the home and the life of someone in need.

When are volunteer opportunities available? The last Saturday in April is usually the annual workday with 900+ county-wide volunteers and 40+ houses to repair, however with the Covid-19 outbreak and elderly clients, emergency repairs are made throughout the year. This year's event will likely take place mid-May.

Any age considerations for volunteers? Age 14 and above can volunteer with parental permission. Otherwise, 18 and older.

How can you get involved? Contact me directly rkozik@comcast.net or look for bulletin announcements.

Any next steps? No training needed just willingness to work. We do appreciate the skills and knowledge of plumbers, electricians, carpenters, HVAC, and other building trades!

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT—HAVE YOU TRIED

IT? At the start of Lent 2020, I made a decision that I would participate in adoration of the holy Eucharist. As a life-long Catholic, I had never taken advantage of this opportunity. I have heard many people remark at what a peaceful and prayerful experience it is. But the thought of sitting quietly for an hour (or more!) was

frightening. Nonetheless, I made it a goal of mine during that Lenten season to give it a try. Then the pandemic came and shut everything down! Even when we were able to resume some remote activities and virtual adoration was offered, I opted not to participate. During Lent 2021, I re-dedicated myself to this experience. I actually sat for 1 hour in quiet prayer, adoration, and thought! Rather than producing the anxiety that I anticipated, , it was calming and peaceful. I think this is going to be a new Lenten tradition for me. If you have never participated in this experience, I encourage you to give it a try.

"THEY WILL KNOW WE ARE CHRISTIANS BY OUR LOVE." Over the past year, Covid has offered some unique challenges and opportunities for the Church.
