





They said, "Men of Galilee,


why are you standing there looking at the sky?

Nicene Creed





Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As we enter the last days of May, it is a very busy time of year in a parish, especially with a school. With all the activities and obligations, I can honestly say that this is the busiest time of year for pastors – but in a "good way." Infant baptisms abound, along with some weddings and funerals in between. It is also a time for bringing a school year to



completion – filled with special events and graduations. Many begin to look forward to summer. It is a very exciting time of year, to be sure!

This time of year is a time to also do some "planning ahead." Thanks to the generosity of some of our parishioners, our Summer Vacation Bible School for our young members and the Teen Summer Mission Trip to Tennessee are both in motion for this summer. As summertime approaches, we also plan for maintenance work that cannot be done the rest of the year. We have to take care of our spiritual home. As I have mentioned many times, there is constantly a lot to maintain here at Jesus the Good Shepherd. Just like your own home, a facility of our size does not run by itself. It takes time, effort and financial support. As summer approaches, may I ask that you maintain and possibly increase somewhat your summer offertory to help maintain our beautiful facility and campus?

Some of our summer maintenance plans call for the much-needed completion of repair work for the large system of gutters and downspouts, replacing outside some crumbling walkways/sidewalks with new concrete, the much-needed renovation of the restrooms in our Centre [which you will be hearing more about during the summer] and other grounds maintenance.

Highest at the top of the summer list of "things to do" is finding a coordinator and an administrative assistant to run our Children's Faith Formation Program. This past year the CFF ran with the extraordinary dedication of one of our parishioners. This individual, however, is moving on to other employment, thus creating a new vacancy.

Our Children's Faith Formation program is a very important part of our mission here at Jesus the Good Shepherd. However, it cannot run itself. There are two staff positions to run the program. Usually by the end of May, we have a draft of a calendar for the following year. At this time, due to staff shortage, there is no calendar yet for CFF next year. Unless some people come forward, it is not seen how this program will continue this coming fall.

Before you go away for a summer break, I ask YOU to consider either yourself or perhaps you can recommend two people for these positions so that CFF can continue at Jesus the Good Shepherd. Please contact me directly [pastor@ccjgs.org] with any recommendations for these positions.

In the meantime, I wish you a happy end of May and God's blessings for a blessed and safe Memorial Day!




Baptism Retreat June 25th!


