JGS Summer Schedule begins Sunday, June 6—the second morning Mass begins at 9:45 a.m. and will be indoors.

Ease of Covid Restrictions at JGS

- Signing in for Mass is no longer required
- Use of masks is not required for fully vaccinated individuals, use of masks is recommended for non-fully vaccinated individuals (adults and children)
- Use of masks will continue for all Eucharistic ministers, both ordinary and extraordinary, during the distribution of the Eucharist
- At communion time: the preferred way in the Archdiocese of Washington (ADW) is still for the Eucharist to be received in the hand. Holy Communion on the tongue is still discouraged for sanitary reasons
- We will have open seating in the 2 center sections of the church, please keep 3 feet or 2 hearts between you and the next family
- Socially distanced seating remains on the far left and right of the church for those who feel more comfortable
- Church pews will be sanitized once a week
- For now, dispensation for attending Sunday Mass is still in affect in the ADW
- Hospitality Sundays will take place once a month during the summer
- Livestream for Sunday Mass will continue.
- Livestream for weekday Mass will be Tuesdays and Thursdays beginning June 1st.



SUMMER MISSION DEAR PARISH FAMILY—UPDATE ON THE **SUMMER MISSION TRIPS:**

Thank you for all the support you have shown the Active Catholic Teens Summer

Mission Trips over the years. For the summer of 2021, we have made the difficult decision to postpone the mission trips for one more year. This decision was based on many factors including participation in ACT during the year, out-of-state travel precautions, and additional testing, quarantine, and vaccine precautions that would be involved in planning this trip.

One of the best things about our mission trips is the relationship we form with the communities we serve. We also want to do what is best for them, to keep them safe as well as our teens. Gathering in large numbers (in Tennessee we typically have around 200 children at our VBS) is just not safe right now.

While we will not travel this year, we are planning to provide material aid (supplies, lesson plans, and possibly videos) to Holy Family parish in Tennessee. Longtime pastor Father Vic Subbs has a team of volunteers locally who would be willing to put on a smaller VBS camp, and we want to support him as much as we can. When we have a list of their needs, we will need your help!

The ACT Teens will be working this year on a Summer Mission on home turf. All the children of our parish are invited to participate in the Summer Mission Vacation Bible School that will take place on campus from June 21 through June 25. We can't wait to serve you! Peace,

CLARIFICATION ON CREMATION AND BURIAL IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH: The Catholic Church as early as 1963 has permitted the option of cremation. Our beautiful cemetery on our grounds allows the burial of a loved one's ashes either in a niche in our Columbarium built for this purpose or in the ground. This is in full compliance with the teaching of the Church. What is not within compliance with the Church, however, is the "scattering of ashes" of a deceased loved one in such places as bodies of water, parks and backyards. After death, the Church reverences the remains of the human body so the remains must be buried in anticipation of the Final Resurrection when the remains of all will rise from the dead for the Final Judgement. As such, a funeral Mass can only occur if the cremated remains of a loved one are properly buried in a cemetery. In planning for one's funeral or for a loved one's funeral, one should, therefore, be suspect of a growing number of offers from the secular funeral industry about "dividing up" the ashes of a loved one and placing them in smaller urns and even in jewelry for distribution to relatives and friends. Such a practice is not allowed by the Catholic Church. If such a practice is done, a Funeral Mass may not take place. Thank you for your understanding in these matters.
