Spotlight On: CHRISTMAS IN APRIL—coordinator Randy Kozik What does this ministry do? Repairs and improve houses of low-income homeowners to ensure they and their families can live in warmth, safety, and independence.

What initially drew you to this ministry? As a new Calvert County teacher back in the 80s, I quickly became aware of the economic contrasts of my students with the most glaring being their housing: some with "outhouses", shallow well pumps, kerosene furnaces or woodburning stoyes in the middle of the main room of the house.

What do you love /enjoy most about this ministry? I love seeing the appreciative smiles and sometimes tears of homeowners, the camaraderie and teamwork of volunteers, the witnessing and participation of reaching out to help a neighbor.

The ministry is great for anyone who wants to improve the home and the life of someone in need.

When are volunteer opportunities available? The last Saturday in April is usually the annual workday with 900+ county-wide volunteers and 40+ houses to repair, however with the Covid-19 outbreak and elderly clients, emergency repairs are made throughout the year. This year's event will likely take place mid-May.

Any age considerations for volunteers? Age 14 and above can volunteer with parental permission. Otherwise, 18 and older.
