




Worship Aid and Bulletin





Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Summer is now very much in the air! How blessed we all are to find ourselves in a much better place compared to this time last year! Many at this time are either on or planning a much-deserved summer break.

As you may know by now, the dispensation not to attend Mass is being lifted and the bishops of

Maryland have asked Catholics to return to Mass the last weekend of this month

Going to Mass, however, is much more about an "obligation." It is deepening our personal relationship with Christ and with the community of believers, the Church. In our case, it is deepening our relationship with the local body of Christ, the parish community. JGS is our spiritual family. Everyone is important. Everyone is welcome. Everyone has a place. Everyone is needed to be the Church that Jesus wants us to be! When you hear/see the word CH__CH, what letters are missing? You got it! UR! YOU ARE the CHURCH!

The month of June is also the time for our annual ordinations for new priests to serve the Archdiocese of Washington. It is my understanding that the Archdiocese is ordaining one new priest. If I recall, a study was done some years ago. In order to maintain current priest staffing levels in our 140 parishes, the archdiocese needs about eight new priests each year.

Religious vocations do not come out of nowhere. Religious vocations come from a parish. Parishes come from families. Families come from homes. All Catholic homes need not only to *pray* for more priests, but to *encourage* priestly vocations. Religious vocations need to be nurtured in home life and, certainly, to be encouraged as a true vocation from God. Please remember in your prayers the need for priests and also encourage priestly vocations in your home!

Let us pray. Faithful and loving God, through your Son's paschal mystery, the mystery of dying and rising, your kingdom has taken root. Keep us patient as your kingdom grows in ways we cannot see. If we become weary of doing what is right, nourish us with your grace. Bring us at last into the harvest of eternal life. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

BAPTISMAL FONT UNDER REPAIR: It was recently discovered that our baptismal font in the church vestibule suffered some mechanical damage during the pandemic due to non-use. Estimates for repairs are underway. It is hoped to get the baptismal font up and running by the end of this summer.

JGS RETURNS TO NORMALCY: Thanks be to God that signs of our parish life prior to the pandemic are returning to Jesus the Good Shepherd. One area still under consideration is the resumption of socials in our Centre, especially funeral receptions. This is on "the list" to be addressed this summer. Funeral receptions require volunteers and not all our volunteers want to return to help at receptions because they are not vaccinated.

MAJOR REPAIR UNDERWAY: Inside our church, behind the altar/sanctuary area, are located the music ministry room, the church sacristy, a rest room and utility closet. Over the last year or so, the floor in the entire space has become unsafe due to sinking. This has created floor and cabinet instability. After inspection by archdiocesan and

engineering experts, the causes that have been determined are poorly compacting soils over the years under the floor as well as poorly poured concrete when this area of the church was first constructed many years ago.

As a result, the entire area is closed until further notice. The repair will require "jack-hammering" the concrete floor, removal of soils, replacement with proper soils, new concrete, removal and replacement of all plumbing, walls, and flooring. This is a major project which will last the majority of the summer months at least. This repair cannot be covered by insurance [Catholic Mutual]. It will cost the parish about \$90,000 which will almost eliminate all of our savings for repairs.

The repair company will be working closely with us to accommodate the on-going use of the church. The church will not be affected. All scheduled events for the use of the church will take place as usual, including weddings and funerals. Thank you for your cooperation during this process!

CLARIFICATION ON CREMATION AND BURIAL IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH: The Catholic Church as early as 1963 has permitted the option of cremation. Our beauti-Memory ful cemetery on our grounds allows the burial of a loved one's ashes either in a niche in our Columbarium built for this purpose or in the ground. This is in full compli-

ance with the teaching of the Church. What is not within compliance with the Church, however, is the "scattering of ashes" of a deceased loved one in such places as bodies of water, parks and backyards. After death, the Church reverences the remains of the human body so the remains must be buried in anticipation of the Final Resurrection when the remains of all will rise from the dead for the Final Judgement. As such, a funeral Mass can only occur if the cremated remains of a loved one are properly buried in a cemetery. In planning for one's funeral or for a loved one's funeral, one should, therefore, be suspect of a growing number of offers from the secular funeral industry about "dividing up" the ashes of a loved one and placing them in smaller urns and even in jewelry for distribution to relatives and friends. Such a practice is not allowed by the Catholic Church. If such a practice is done, a Funeral Mass may not take place. Thank you for your understanding in these matters.
