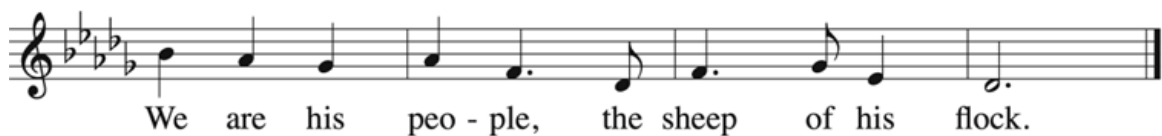
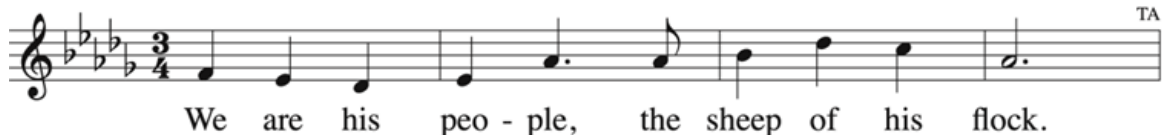

NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

First, I wish all the FATHERS of our community a blessed and wonderful FATHER'S DAY! May God bless you on your special day for all that you have done and are doing for your families, things seen and unseen. God sees all that you do!

Today, the Church re-enters Ordinary Time, after the Lent-Easter-Solemnities' cycle [Pentecost, Holy Trinity, Body and Blood of Christ]. In a sense, Ordinary time is really "extra-ordinary!" We continue to celebrate the mystery of dying and rising with Christ revealed to us in the Paschal Mystery, the passion, death and resurrection of Christ. This mystery is on-going in our lives; we can count on the presence of Christ to be with us in each and every moment!

I hope the summer affords you time for a change of pace. Some have asked if things "slow down" in the parish during the summer. To be honest, a parish never stops. A parish is always to serve the people --and the needs of people are on-going. So, summer time in a parish does not really slow down. There are still baptisms, funerals [as I write this, I am in-between two funerals], ministry to the sick at home and in the hospital, staff transitions to deal with [see below], planning for the fall, meetings to organize and maintenance projects [short-term and long-term] to get done during the summer. For example, among the latter, a new fire alarm system is scheduled to be installed throughout the entire facility this summer. Our current one is quite dated and needs improvement on several security and safety levels.

Personally, I will be taking a day off "here and there" but that is about it. While we are blessed with two wonderful deacons, deacons cannot celebrate Mass, hear confessions, or anoint the sick, especially in cases of emergency. On a more practical level, it is becoming increasingly more difficult to find priest "supply-help." Pastors used to be able to depend on religious order priests to help out on weekends but their numbers are also down and less available. What priests we have are already quite stretched. This past weekend, I celebrated five Masses, which I was happy to do - but this was unheard of before. We have a number of pastors already on leave for various reasons, so our ranks are even more "thin." May I ask you in a particular way especially during these summer months to pray more for our priests? Thank you!

Let us pray. *God of all peoples, you call your Church to holiness. Help your people to set aside off-putting attitudes and behaviors, and make us a people who live in love and act with care for all the world. Give us wisdom to serve your people. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.*

For Your Safety

JGS has a gas stove and several gas fireplaces. Natural gas is a colorless, odorless fuel. For safety reasons, a chemical odorant called mercaptan is added for easy detection. This odorant has a distinctive "rotten egg" type scent. Natural gas odors should be reported right away. If you smell this odor, alert others and leave the area immediately, leave the doors open as you exit. Do not try to locate the source of the smell.
