





Corpus Christi Sequence: This Sequence is only one of four sequences preserved in the Roman Missal from before the Council of Trent in 1570, and it provides a reflection on the honor of the real presence of the body (corpus) of Jesus in the Eucharist. Below is the shorter form of this sequence by a contemporary composer. The Gospel Acclamation is seamlessly at the end of this sequence, so please stand when the Cantor guides you.

Circling back to today's Solemnity, when



To be eligible for admission to our Children's Faith Formation Program, reception of the Sacraments or to receive testimonial letters for sponsorship, an individual must be a registered, participating member of the parish, attend the sacraments, and support the parish via offertory and involvement.

Please do not set a date before making Church arrangements first. Dates for weddings will not be arranged before a preliminary meeting.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK AND HOLY COMMUNION: Please contact the church office if you or a family member is homebound, in the hospital, or in a nursing home and would like to receive these sacraments. We will do our best as restrictions allow during the pandemic.
