## / For Your Safety

JGS has a gas stove and several gas fireplaces. Natural gas is a colorless, odorless fuel. For safety reasons, a chemical odorant called mercaptan is added for easy detection. This odorant has a distinctive "rotten egg" type scent. Natural gas odors should be reported right away. If you smell this odor, alert others and leave the area immediately, leave the doors open as you exit. Do not try to locate the source of the smell.
