





Gospel: Mark 5:21-43

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live." He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him. There was a woman afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years. She had suffered greatly at the hands of many doctors and had spent all that she had. Yet she was not helped but only grew worse. She had heard about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak. She said, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." Immediately her flow of blood dried up. She felt in her body that she was healed of her affliction. Jesus, aware at once that power had gone out from him, turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who has touched my clothes?" But his disciples said to Jesus, "You see how the crowd is pressing upon you, and yet you ask, 'Who touched me?'" And he looked around to see who had done it. The woman, realizing what had happened to her, approached in fear and trembling. She fell down before Jesus and told him the whole truth. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction." While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?" Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them, "Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep." And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all out. He

took along the child's father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to her, "*Talitha koum*," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded. He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.





As many know by now, this weekend marks our return to "normal" and the removal of the general dispensation not to attend Mass due to the pandemic. The last several weekends I have noticed the return of more and more parishioners to Mass. This is wonderful! Coming to Mass is a reminder that



we are a sacramental people – the Lord calls us together – to be the Church he wants us to be!

Regardless, there are specific persons for whom the dispensation may still be applicable [such the homebound and seriously ill]:

- You are sick or you have a health condition that would be significantly compromised if you were to contract a communicable illness.
- 2. You are experiencing flu-like symptoms.
- 3. You have been exposed to someone who has tested positive or you have reason to think you might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness.
- 4. You care for the sick, homebound or infirm.
- 5. You are pregnant.
- 6. You are 65 years of age or older [per the CDC's recommendation of high-risk individuals].
- 7. You cannot attend Mass through no fault of your own [e.g., you are sick, your ride did not show up, the church and centre were at capacity a given weekend Mass].
- 8. You have significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass

Like you, I am very happy that, with rare exceptions, all parish ministries and gatherings are returning to normal this summer. Certainly, by Labor Day weekend, parish life will really be on the upswing again! We cannot live without the Eucharist and the Church is not fully alive without its people. We cannot wait to welcome you back to Jesus the Good Shepherd! God bless you!






MAJOR REPAIR UNDERWAY: Inside our church, behind the altar/sanctuary area, are located the music ministry room, the church sacristy, a rest room and utility closet. Over the last year or so, the floor in the entire space has become unsafe due to sinking. This has created floor and cabinet instability. After inspection by archdiocesan and

engineering experts, the causes that have been determined are poorly compacting soils over the years under the floor as well as poorly poured concrete when this area of the church was first constructed many years ago.

As a result, the entire area is closed until further notice. The repair will require "jack-hammering" the concrete floor, removal of soils, replacement with proper soils, new concrete, removal and replacement of all plumbing, walls, and flooring. This is a major project which will last the majority of the summer months at least. This repair cannot be covered by insurance [Catholic Mutual]. It will cost the parish about \$90,000 which will almost eliminate all of our savings for repairs.

The repair company will be working closely with us to accommodate the on-going use of the church. The church will not be affected. All scheduled events for the use of the church will take place as usual, including weddings and funerals. Thank you for your cooperation during this process!


