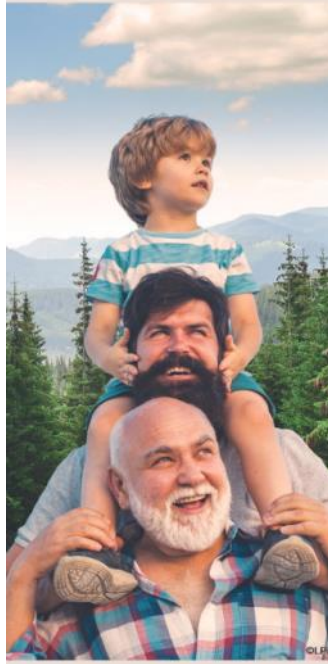


Baptism Retreat June 25th!

Masses will be celebrated for all fathers enrolled in the 9 day Novena from June 21—June 30.

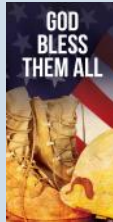

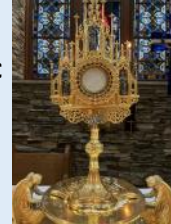

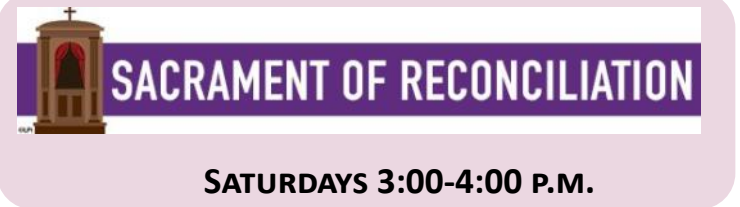
