



Pentecost Sequence: The Pentecost Sequence is only one of four sequences preserved in the Roman Missal from before the Council of Trent in 1570, and it provides a reflection on the coming of the Holy Spirit into our hearts and lives. The Gospel Acclamation is seamlessly at the end of this sequence, so please stand when the Cantor guides you.








Baptism Retreat June 25th!


